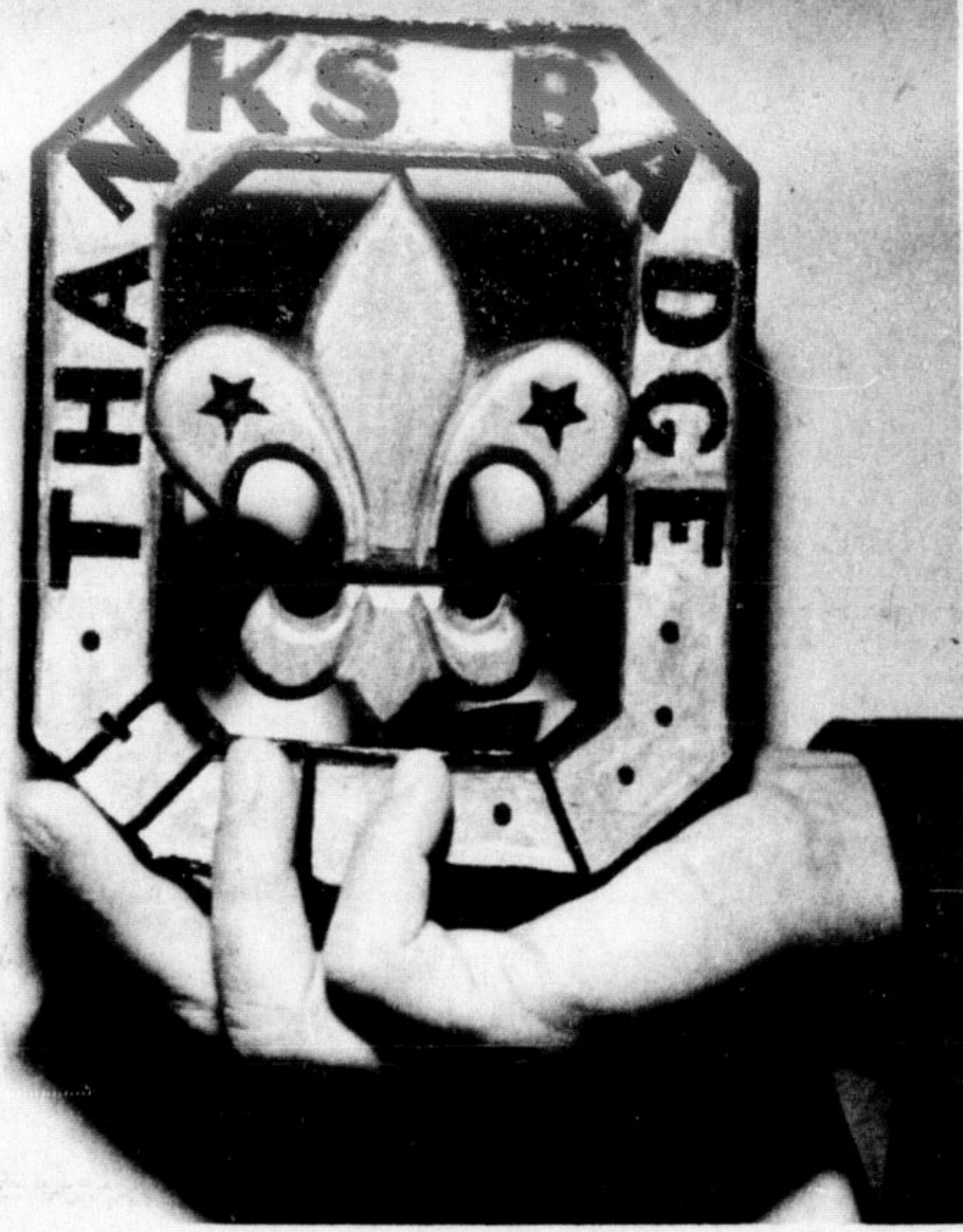

During a meeting of Milton Council on Monday evening, members:

\* Noted a meeting was scheduled with Nassagaweya and Esqueping representatives to discuss the Milton Heights water situation. The date was September 4.

\* Received a letter from Miss Jean Purdy supporting the request for a continuation of passenger service on the CPR.

\* Appointed Bruce McKerr and Wilf Penson inspectors during the construction of the new pumping station at the sewage treatment plant.

\* Received letters of appreciation from the Provincial Council of the Boy Scouts of Canada and from a parent of one of the Scouts, expressing appreciation to the people of Milton and district for their help during the recent jamboree that was washed out with heavy rains.

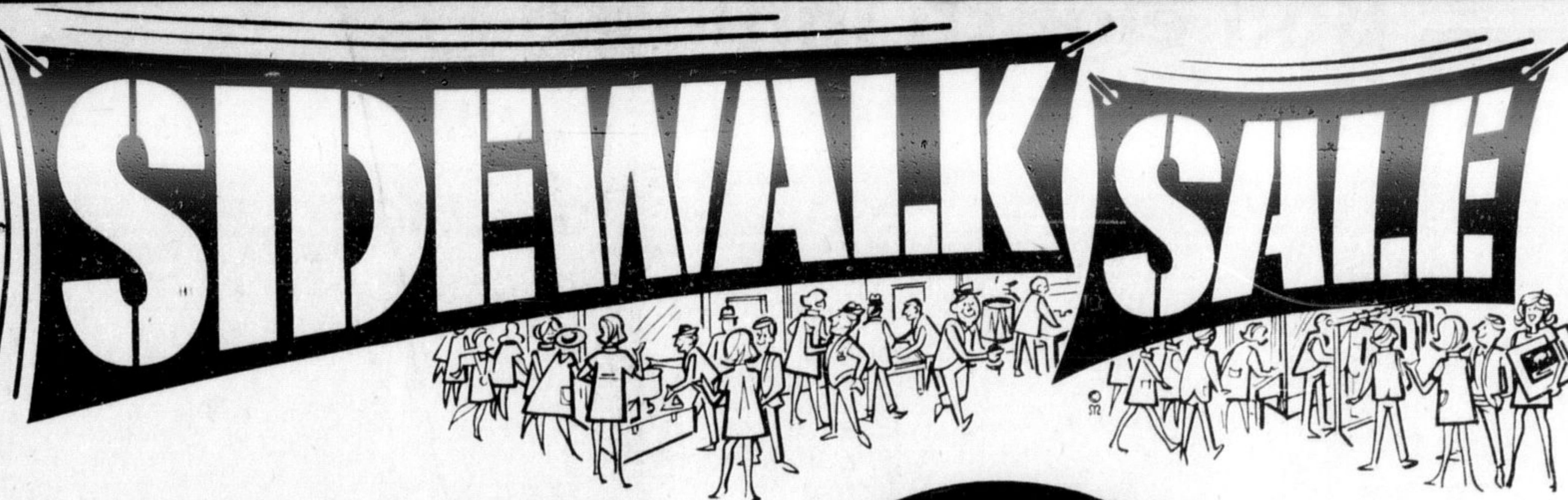
\* Referred to the works committee a request from the Department of Transport for space on the Mary St. parking lot to conduct motorcycle tests for one hour a week.

\* Received a complaint regarding the cleanliness of the swimming pool and change house from Mrs. Joan Oakley and referred the matter to the recreation and parks committees.

\* Learned the Department of Transport had referred to the Department of Highways, the town's complaint about not being permitted a traffic signal at Main and Ontario St. A further letter, it was understood, would explain the town could proceed with the traffic signal but no subsidy would be paid on its erection or maintenance costs.
