Revenue minister is speaker at Halton P.C. annual meeting

The Hon. John D. White, Ontario Minister of Revenue, told the annual meeting of Halton (federal) and Halton East (provincial) Conservative Association there would be no tax on foods.

Mr. White was the main speaker at the annual meeting Wednesday evening in Oakville. He spoke of the government's work done by the select committee on taxation. Mr. White said the committee

recommended a municipal equalization grant program. "We suggested the provincial government give a grant on the average assessment on each municipality."

He outlined several of the 347 recommendations in the Smith Report and told the meeting the committee had heard 115 delegations, received 356 briefs and made 134 changes in the recommendations.

Other speakers included Alan Eagleson of Toronto, a candidate for the presidency of the Ontario Progressive Conservative Association, Bruno Bragoli of Hamilton, Andrew Frame of Toronto and W. S. Thomson of Oakville, all vice-presidential candidates.

Elected president of the Association was John Kilmer, succeeding Doug Latimer of Georgetown. Elected to office with him were first vice-president Bob Reid of Milton, second vice-president Ruth Trustrum of Oakville and third vice-president Norm Nickson of Erin. Secretary is George Norrie of Oakville and treasurer John Dewep of Oakville. With the exception of the office of the third vice-president both the Federal and Provincial Associations will be the same. The Provincial Association does not have a third vice-president.

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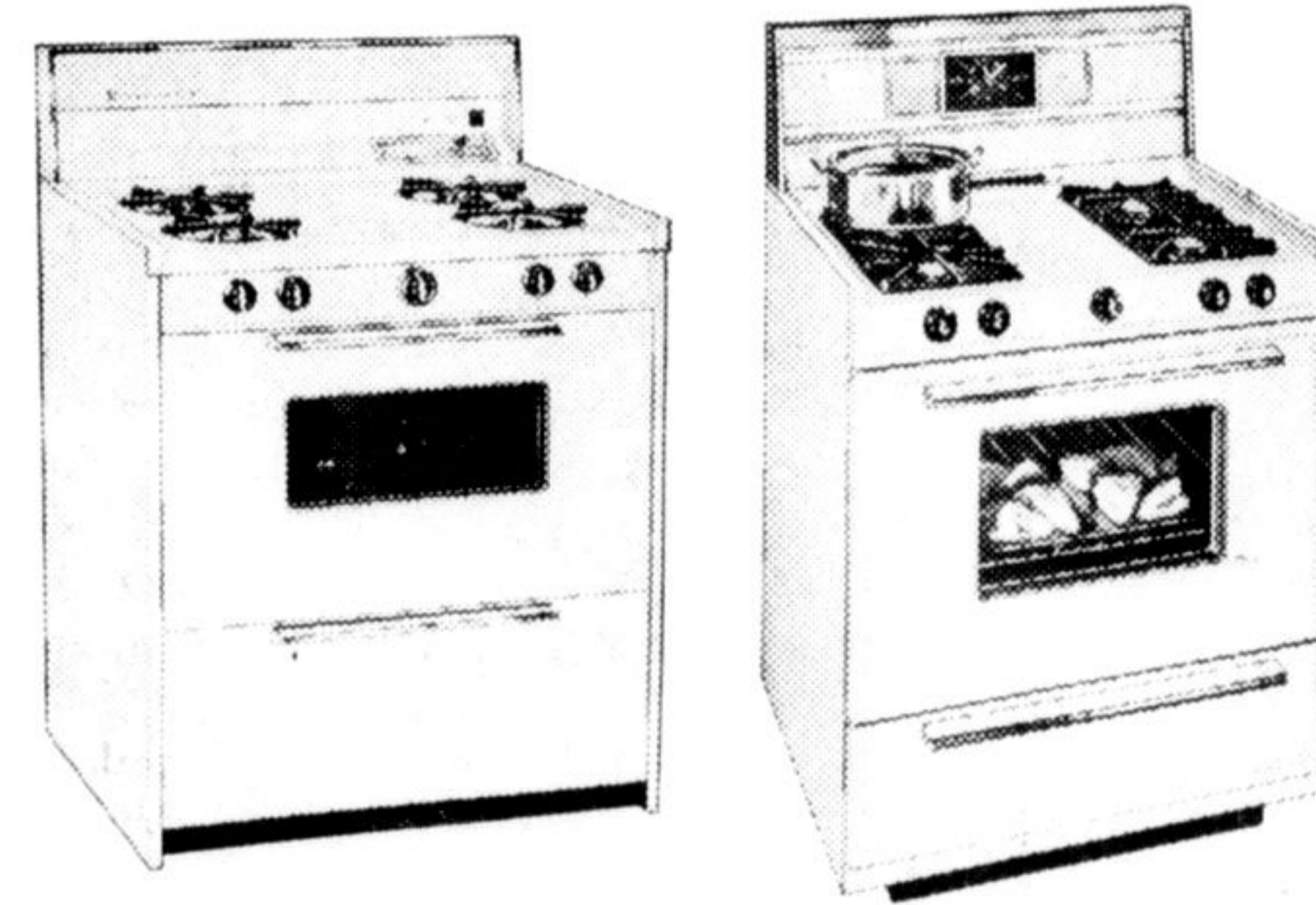
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
