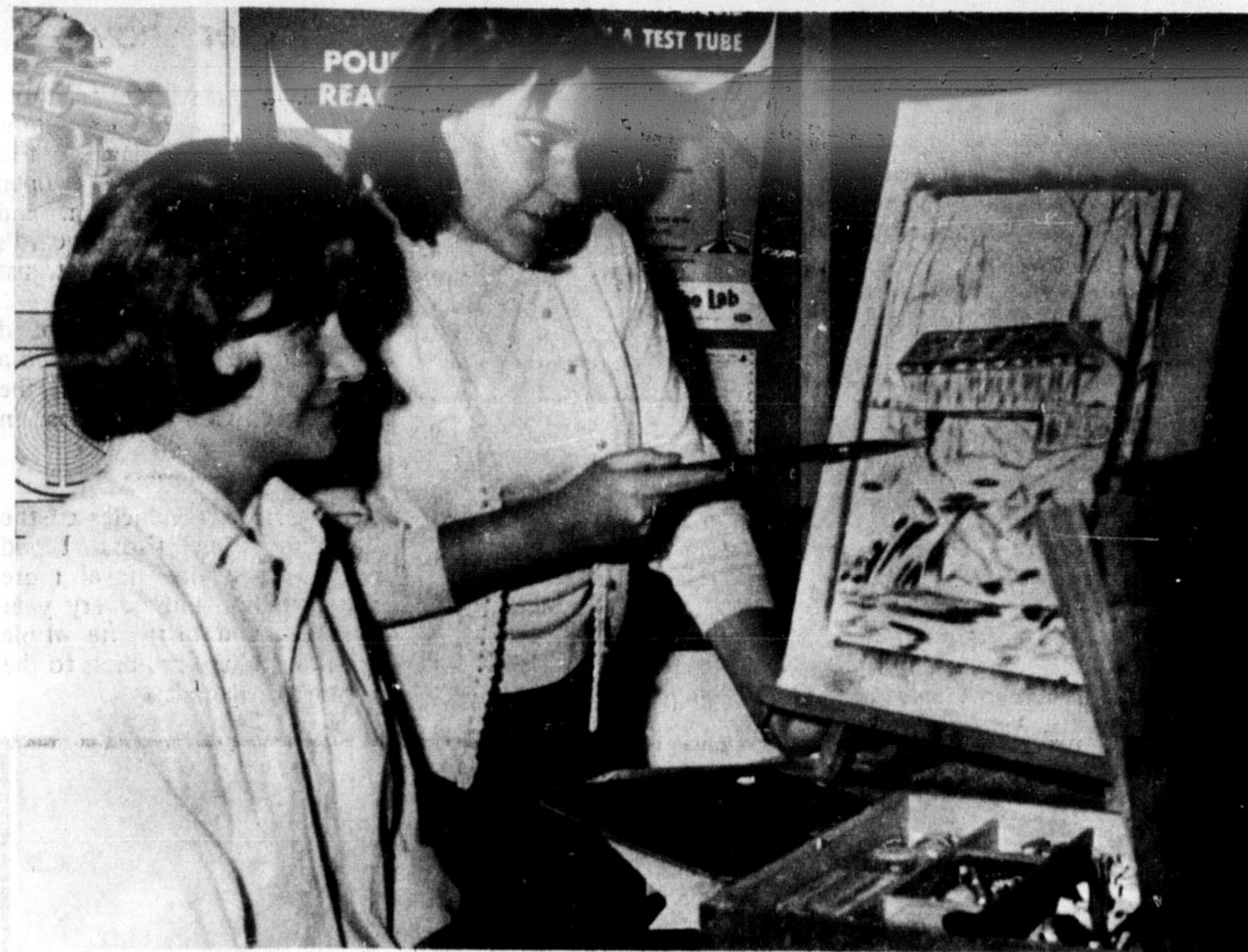


**250 at Milton Night School**

Approximately 250 people are attending night school at Milton District High School this year. The courses vary from conversational French to flower arranging and Christmas decorations but each course is of a recreational nature.

Many of the students have attended courses for several years now. Some take a different course each year and some study the same subject in more depth each year.

Although there are definite skills one picks up from the course, students are not confined to the restrictions found in an ordinary classroom situation. Many look forward to the course as an entertaining evening.

In the past few years the committee has dwindled from about seven people to three this year. The program is headed by chairman Mrs. G. Roberts and secretary-treasurer Mrs. R. G. King.

Although there is little doubt about the probability of having night school next year, any planning for the future is up in the air awaiting some guideline to be set down by the County School Board.

This year the shop courses had to be removed from the agenda when it was found the shops were delayed in the expansion of the high school.

The courses being studied this year include conversational French, beginners oil painting, advanced oil painting, beginners sewing, advanced sewing, tailoring, typewriting, women's physical fitness, needlepoint, knitting, tating, smoking and crocheting, flower arranging and Christmas decorations and leather crafts.
