**Coaches, sponsors needed for hockey**

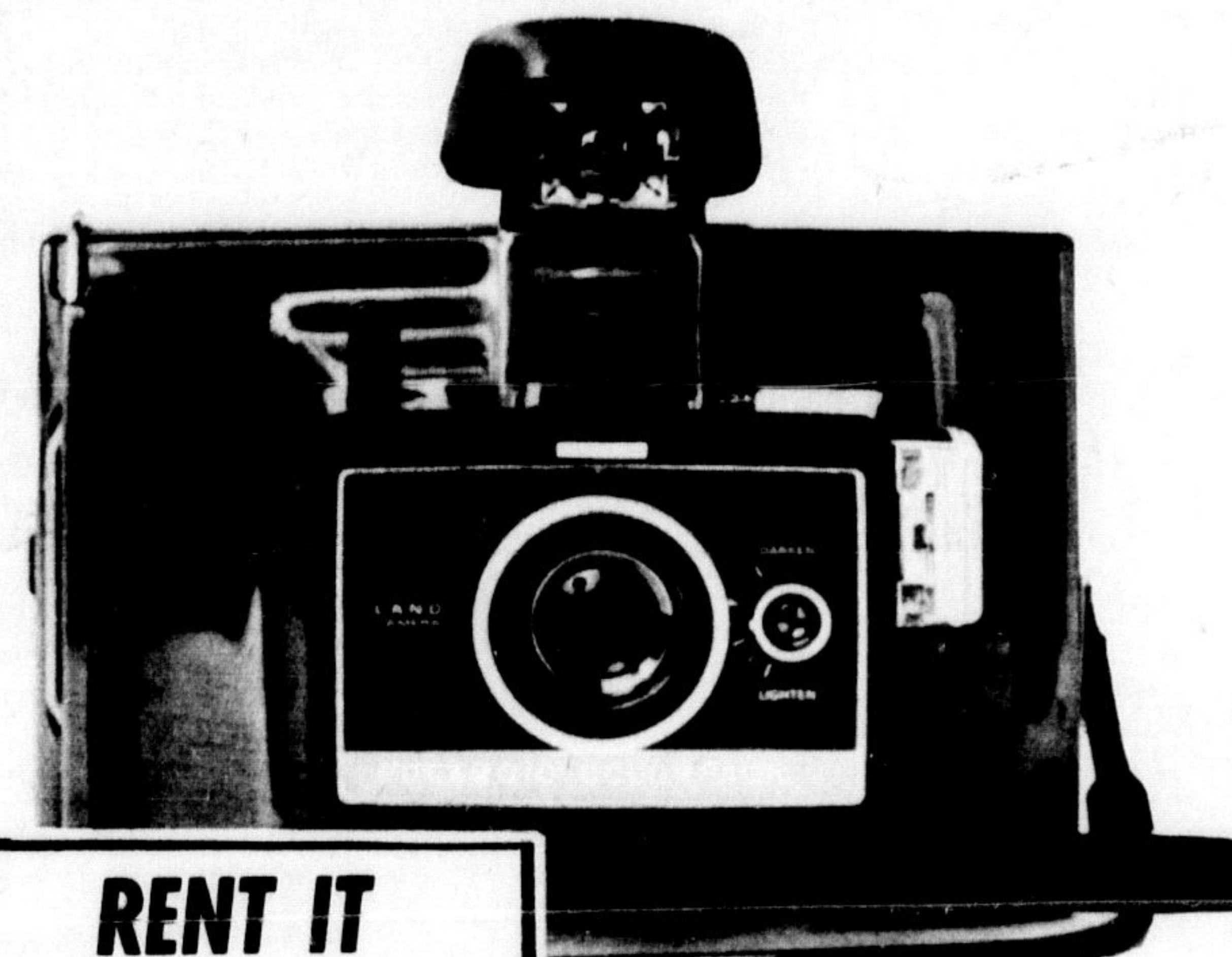
Although summer's here and most people's minds are far away from hockey, Milton's Minor Hockey Association has been busy setting up plans for another busy season next year.

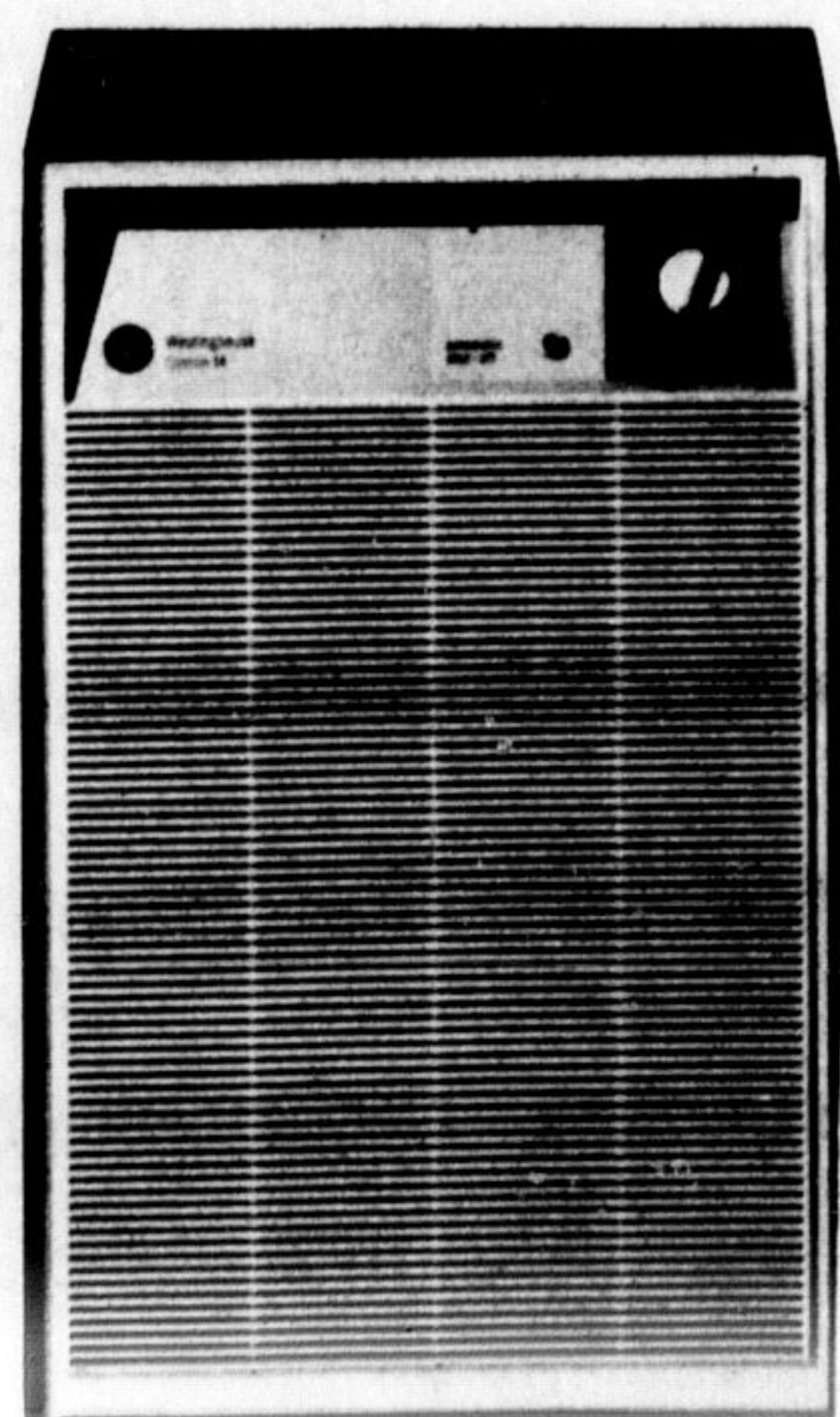
