Administrative centre in old Heights school

Milton Heights will be the administrative centre for the County Board of Education's northern unit, members agreed Thursday. Three assistant superintendents as well as consultants will be located there.

Georgetown for those officials serving the schools in the Georgetown and Acton high school areas and an office at Milton Heights for officials serving the Milton High School area.

Members agreed with a recommendation of the administration, that the single office should be established at Milton Heights in the school recently taken out of use. The audio-visual centre will be accommodated in the portable at Georgetown and in the Milton High School.

"As soon as accommodation becomes available a permanent centre should be established in Georgetown", the Assistant Director told the Board. He noted this might be possible in 1970 or 1971 with new school facilities now under construction there.

Resource centre for Milton will cost board \$63,540

A \$63,540 tender for the construction of a resource centre at the Martin St. school was accepted by the County Board of Education Thursday. The successful bidder was A. J. McCarthy Construction Ltd. The budget on the project had tentatively indicated an expected price of \$48,000. Bids ranged as high as \$88,574. Included in the total \$76,000 program is site development for addition of a parking lot, equipment, architect's fees of \$4,000 and a contingency fund of \$1,460.

On a recorded vote members agreed to return the \$2,500 bond of Ray Olan Contractors Ltd. despite the submission of a low estimate, withdrawn after opening of the bids. Trustee John Noble explained the Milton contractor had discovered a mathematical error after the \$47,215 bid had been opened on the Martin St. project. In such cases the bid bond, which is the contractor's guarantee of the bid, is forfeited.

Asks board eliminate religious education from Halton schools

A request that religious education be eliminated from Halton schools was submitted to the County Board of Education Thursday by Charles L. Rea, a father of two young children and Tyler Ave. Acton resident.

Board members agreed to review the present regulations and the present condition of the program in the schools. In a letter to the Board, Mr. Rea expressed support for the recommendations of the recent McKay report to the Ontario Legislature.

Noting there are many beliefs to choose from, Mr. Rea suggests that "to give small children the impression that certain beliefs of Christianity represent the one true way, and always have, is a distortion not only of history, but of the present".

Assistant Director D. S. Lawless pointed out the Board must have the permission of the Minister of Education if the program is not to be offered in Halton schools. Trustee L. Pease suggested the letter was written in a disquieting tone and "I resent the implication that we are reacting to it. This board is only six months old. I sometimes wonder whose civil liberties are being protected by legislation, the majority or the minority."

Background material on the subject is to be prepared for the trustees for further considerations.
