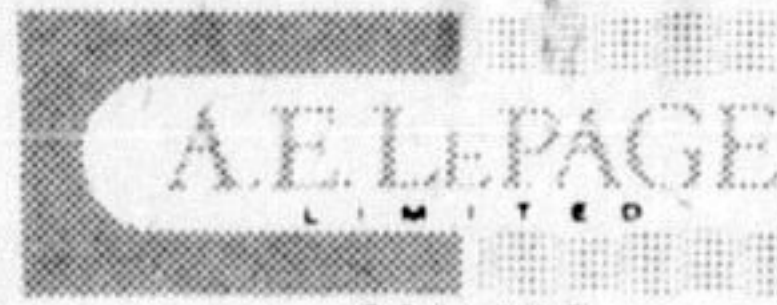

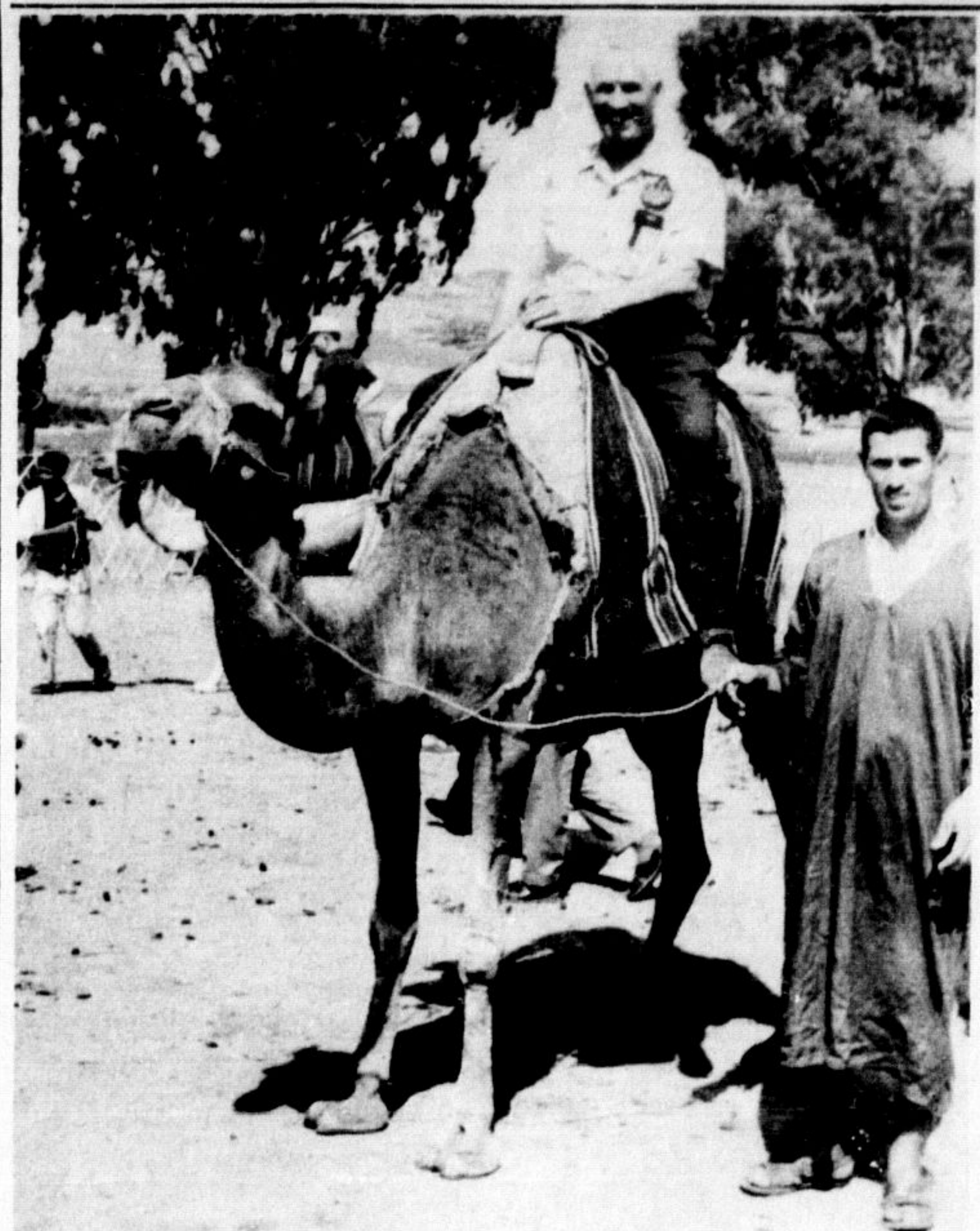

March there was an indication that Ng Bow Jung and her family of Hong Kong had been accepted as immigrants to Canada. In view of the limited facilities, however, for background enquiries, it was not expected they could be admitted until the end of June.
With the paperwork complete, the escape successful, Chun Fan and his family boarded a plane for their flight via Tokyo, Alaska and Vancouver to Toronto. On July 2 the families were reunited.
Things are different in Canada. In China the children attended school for half a day and worked for half a day. Now the need is to have English classes and that is Rud Whiting's next interest. If they're available Mrs. Bing Eng wants to take them too. Despite her 62 years and Canadian residence since 1953, she wants to be able to do more than make change when she accompanies her husband to sell their market garden produce in Toronto.
Bing Eng learned his English at the market where he makes his 4.30 a.m. daily trips to sell the produce from his market garden. He raises the whole range of vegetables there as well as Chinese vegetables. Now Chun Fan will be able to help with those trips and with the harvesting and garden work.
It's a happy family group on the R. R. 2, Hornby farm now. When M.P. Whiting called at the farm recently he didn't know the family had arrived from Hong Kong. "I had made a note that the projected date of their arrival was to be the end of June and as I had heard nothing further from either the Department of Immigration or the Eng family, I was calling personally to see if I could be of further assistance to them on my return to Ottawa".
The M.P. received a royal welcome. The family was all in the fields despite the high temperature but the arrival of Rud Whiting was cause for a celebration and all work stopped.
