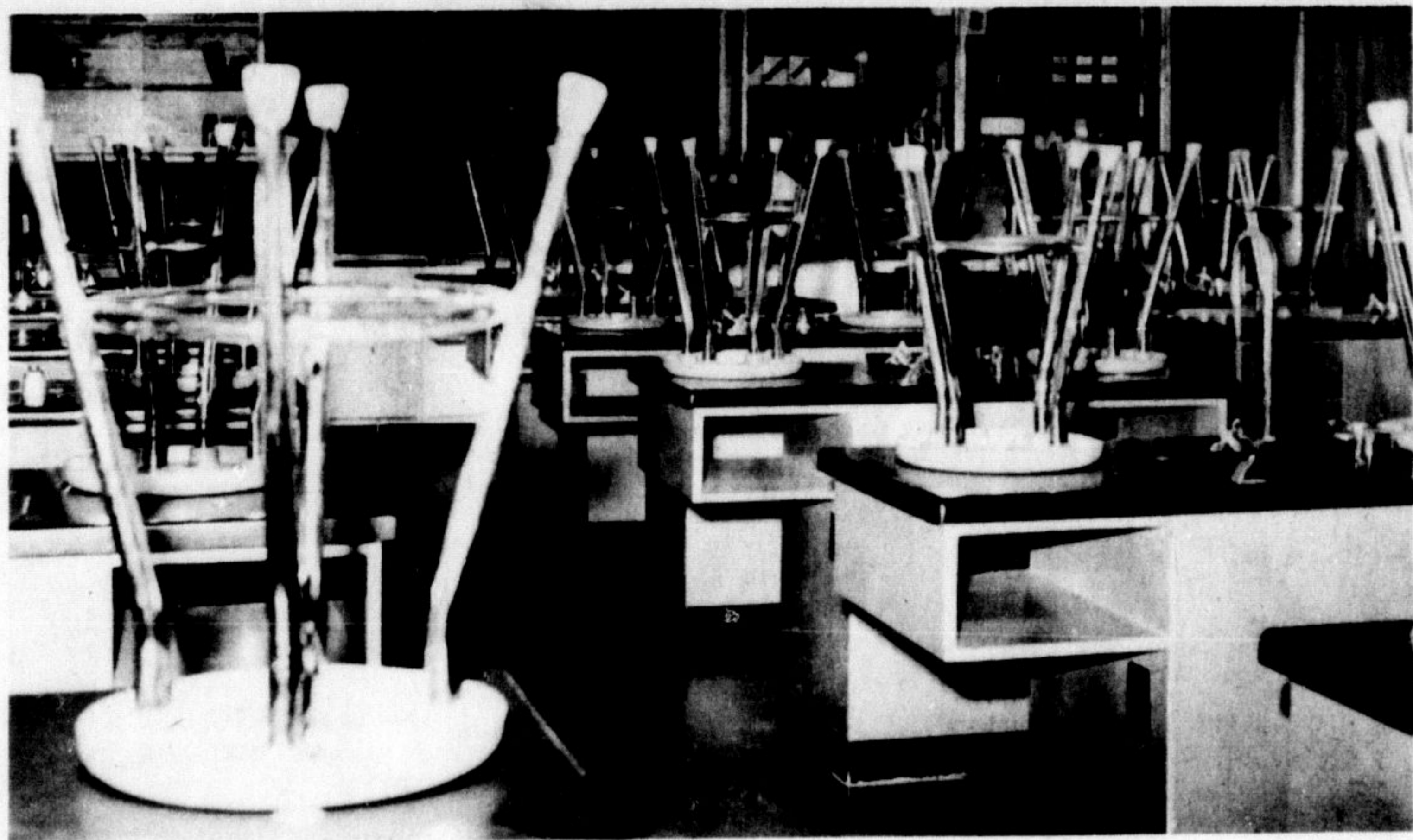


READY AND WAITING for the swarm of students to come and pick them up is this huge pile of books located in the gymnasium of Milton District High School. These books are available for

Special committee examines school religious education

A special committee including community representatives, will study religious education in Halton Schools and submit recommendations to the Halton County School Board by next March.

The committee will examine the Mackay Report and its implications for Halton students. Interim reports on the committee activity are to be requested in November and January.

Membership on the committee is to include four trustees, two senior board officials, two representatives of the ministry, one representative from the Home and School Council, two

students and two representatives from the community as well as four representatives of the teaching staff.

The Board authorized the committee to call witnesses, receive briefs and obtain information to make their report as comprehensive as possible.

Major recommendations in the Mackay report included abandonment of the present course in religious education, the maintenance of prayers for opening exercises but with a more universal character. It was suggested in the report that character building could best be

accomplished through a program that pervades all aspects of education and includes a growth of knowledge about and respect for all religions.

Membership on the County committee will be considered by the chairman and the director and recommended to the Board.

Damage reports still coming in

Damage reports are still coming in from last week's violent rainstorm which left up to half a foot of water in some areas of Halton County. At Thursday night's meeting of the Halton Region Conservation Authority executive, manager Dave Murray reported close to \$1,000 damage had been done at Kelso as a result of the downpour.

He said some roads, culverts and slopes of banks had been washed out by the rainfall which amounted to 5.6 inches at Kelso.

Another damage report was received by the executive but it came from a rather unusual source—Oakville's Glen Abbey Golf Club. In their letter to the Conservation Authority, the golf club is seeking payment of damages to the course when the 16-Mile Creek flooded its banks during the storm. The

Conservation Authority serves the watershed of the 16-Mile Creek.

The manager of the course complained to the executive in his letter that damage was done to culverts, two bridges were washed out, water lines were

ruptured and litter, including a new picnic table of "doubtful" origin, was spread over parts of the course.

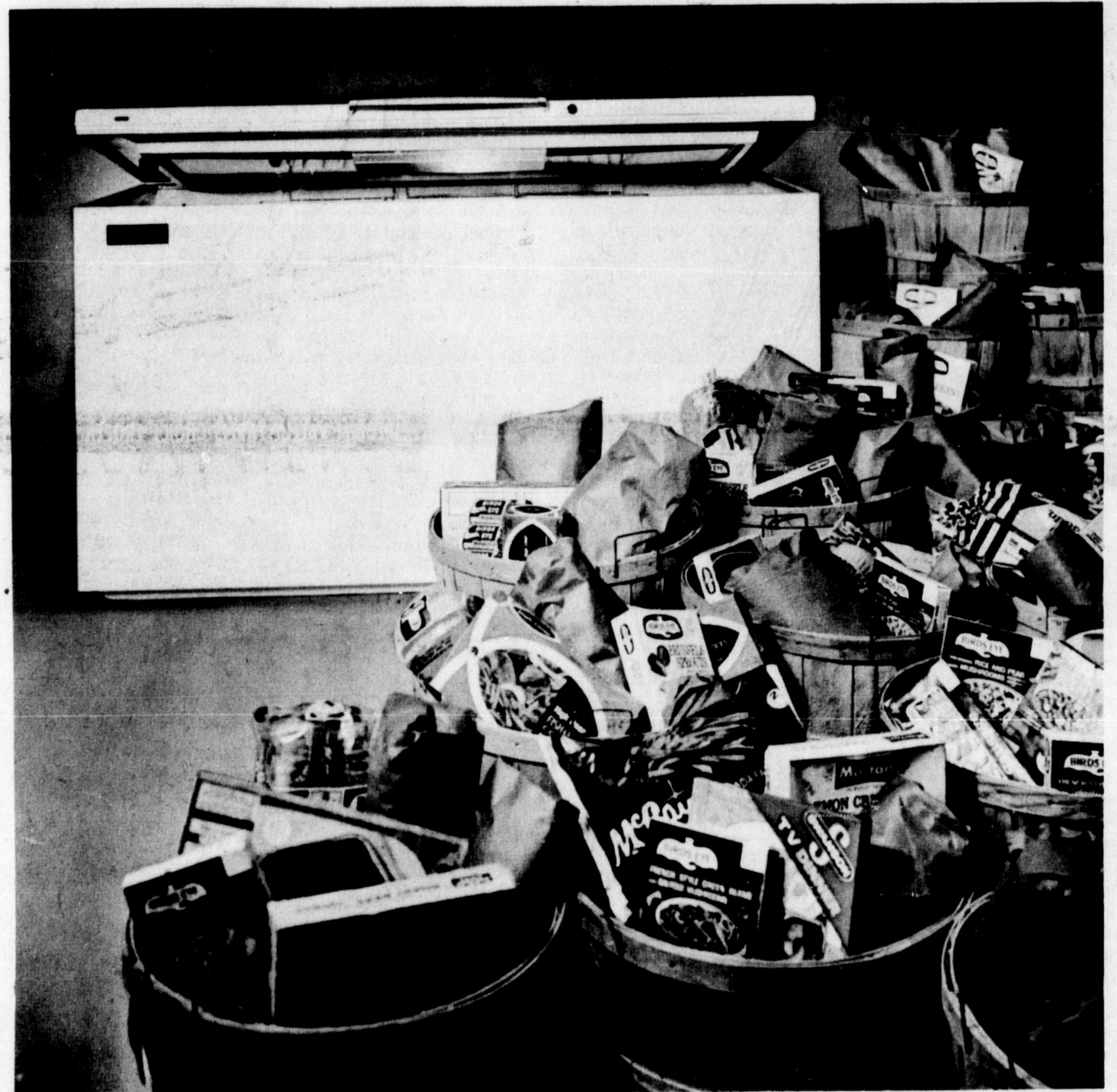
