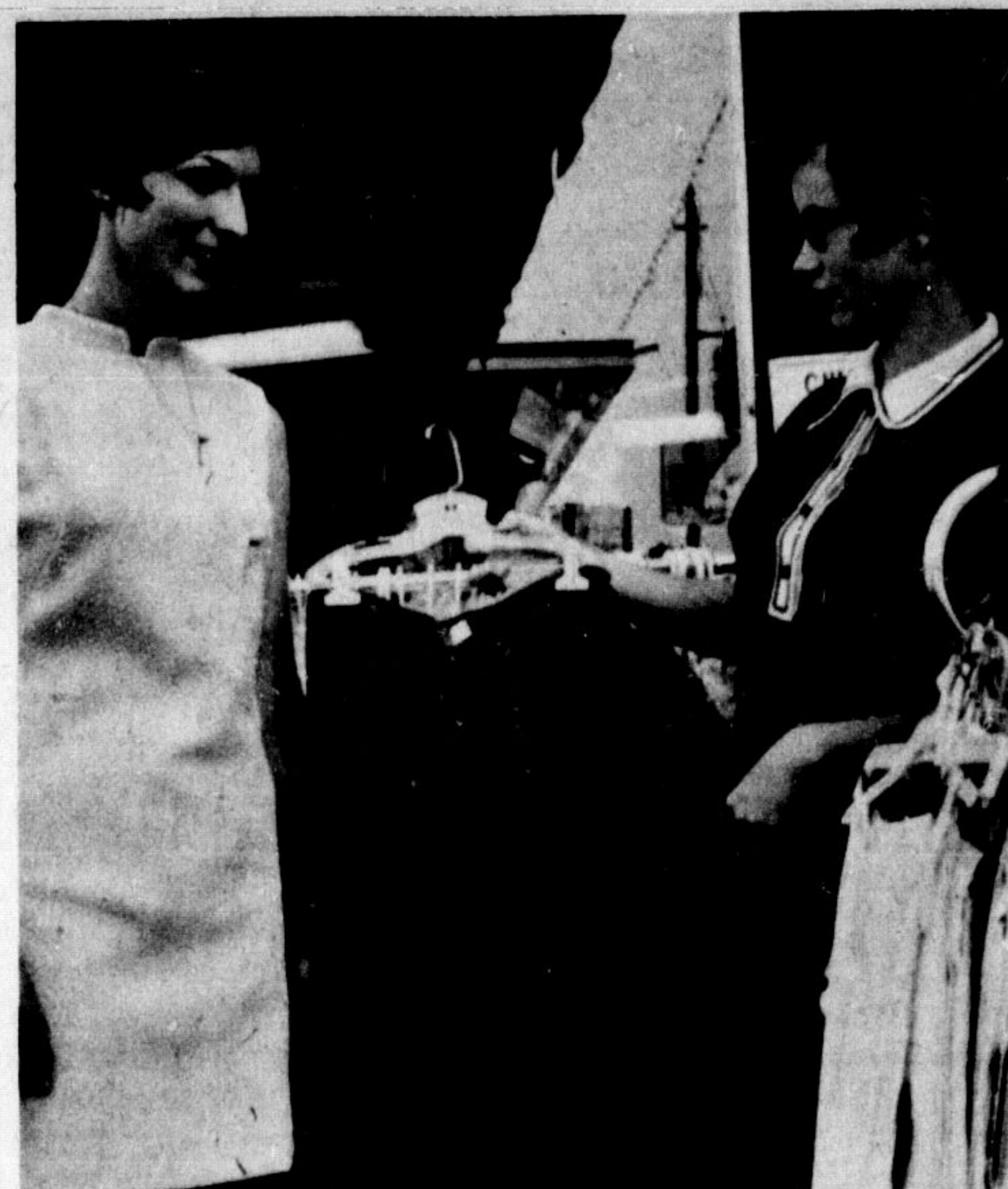

Steam-Era best yet . . .

and an assortment of early Canadiana in the first two halls, an expanded model engine display in the Scout Hall, and more antiques all shined and labelled beneath the grandstand. A dog-powered treadmill ran a churn, a small motor powered antique melodeon, and one of Canada's largest collections of watch fobs was on display.

There were food booths everywhere, operated by Milton Lions Club, Rockwood Presbyterian Church, Knox Church Board of Managers, Limehouse W.A., St. Stephen's Church Hornby, and Kilbride Scouts Group Committee. Beneath the grandstand, the WAVES of Omagh Church of Christ ran a restaurant which served around 1,500 full course hot meals to visitors, in aid of Great Lakes Bible College, Beamsville.

A blacksmith shop was set up and operating, forge and blower and all, with William Moore of Caledonia as the smithy. At the grandstand each afternoon, Vince Mountford and a bevy of entertainers kept the audience giggling and tapping their toes in time to the music.

Vince's helpers this year were folk singer Earl Burt and 1969 Fiddle Queen Karen O'Rourke of Acton on the Friday; accordionist Nicol Brown, champion old-time fiddler Laura Hieghway of Uxbridge, provincial junior stepdance champion Anna Redman, and pianist Iva Davidson on the Saturday; plus a few locals who climbed the stage to perform as amateurs.

Milton Girls' Pipe Band, always a hit with the crowd, performed Saturday and Monday and led Saturday's downtown parade.

The club's own sawmill, rebuilt this year on a rubber tired truck frame for maximum portability, thrilled many visitors who had never seen logs being sawn before.

The Country Store, another project the women took over this year, really looked like one. It offered jam, honey, preserves, potholders, aprons, bookmarks, pie, and penny candy for sale and in one corner a trading post was set up for members wishing to sell antique equipment. The women also sold copies of a special "Steam-Era Cookbook" which was filled with recipes

contributed by members.

That calliope was back again from the Minnie Thomson Memorial Museum at Stratford, and operator Dave Thomson kept crowds amused with his renditions of old favorites like "Oh Susannah" on the big steam organ.

Champion coverage of the weekend reunion includes several pictures and other stories inside this week's issue. Copies of this week's Champion are being mailed out to the 260 members of the Steam and Antique Association and many of the show's visitors.

—The sun is setting earlier each evening, and autumn is on the way.

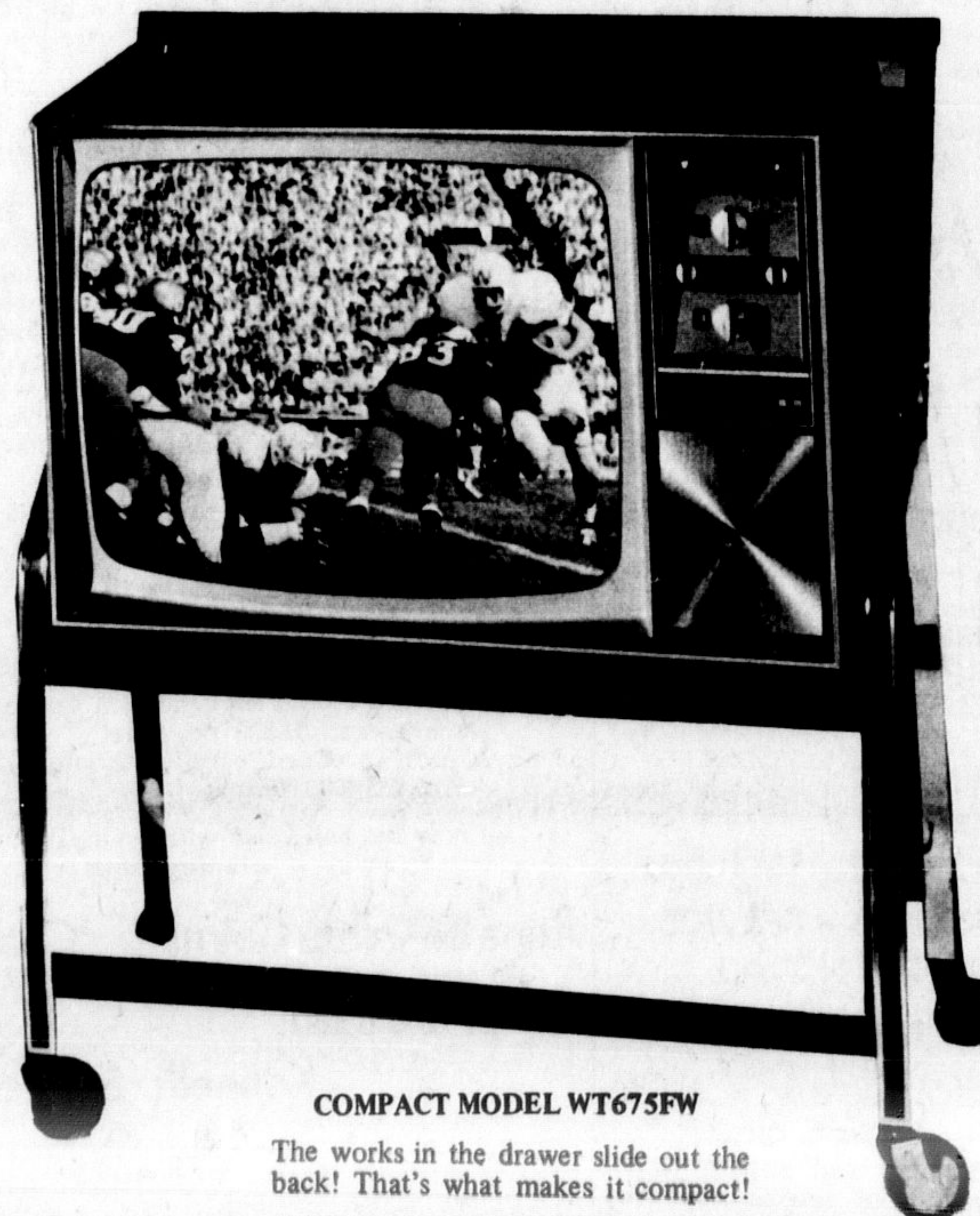
