# Lowville's outstanding season ends with ORSA title theirs

Lowville Intermediates won the ORSA Intermediate Championship by defeating the defending champions, Innerkip, in two straight games, 4-0 on Thursday and 10-2 on Sunday. Jacques Paquette hurled a brilliant three-hitter Thursday in Innerkip. He struck out 16, walked one and hit one batter. Lowville scored two runs in the second inning on a single by David Gates, a fielder's choice by Paquette, a walk to Stu King and a single by Doug Coverdale. They added two insurance runs in the eighth inning. Dennis Sinclair led off with a single, Doug Coverdale got on base with a fielder's choice and an error by Innerkip allowed one run to score and Doug Powell singled home the final run. David Gates collected three singles while Stu King, Doug Coverdale, Lee Coulson, Dennis Sinclair and Doug Powell all singled for a total of eight Lowville hits. Paquette hurled the final game on Sunday, giving up five hits, issuing one walk and fanning ten.

Innerkip jumped into a 2-0 lead in the first inning but Lowville came back with one in the first, two in the fourth, four more in the fifth, two in the sixth and a final run in the seventh. Lowville's run in the first inning came on a long homer by second baseman Doug Powell. In the fourth, Bruce Carver homered, Jacques Paquette singled, Burkes Harrison reached base on an error and playing coach Stu King singled to drive in the winning run. Doug Coverdale led off the fifth with a double, Murray Dawson followed with a double, Bruce Carver doubled to score Dawson, Burke Harrison walked and a single by Jacques Paquette scored two runs.

The two runs in the sixth were scored on a single by Stu King, a walk to Doug Powell, a single by Doug Coverdale and a single by David Gates. Lowville's final run came in the seventh on a walk to Bruce Peer, an Innerkip error, Stu King was hit by a pitch to load the bases and Doug Powell sacrificed fly. Bruce Carver led the hitting attack with a homer and double, Murray Dawson and Doug Coverdale each had a double and single, Stu King and rookie Dave Gates and Burke Harrison all came through with two singles. Doug Powell belted a key homer and Jacques Paquette singled.
