Board of Education HIGHLIGHTS

During a regular meeting of the Halton County Board of Education on Thursday members:

* Authorized the employment of a student-assistant from the Psychological Department of the University of Waterloo for a four month period at a cost of \$2,600. The student, with a masters degree in psychology and working on a doctorate, will assist the three psychologists currently working in the system.

* Approved sketch plans for the addition to the Montclair Senior Public School and a projected budget of \$272,000 for the project. The addition will include a music room classroom, gymnasium with stage and two change rooms. It was reported the original school was approved by the Department of Education without the facilities, under the Oakville Board, on condition the facilities be added.

* Agreed to refuse commercial firms the use of schools for publicity purposes and ruled that non-commercial

organizations would be permitted general announcements, immediately prior to dismissal, when the announcements had been approved by the Director of Education. Requests to conduct educational contests will also be considered by the Director.

* Agreed to provide a maximum of \$150 annually to each secondary school to be used at the discretion of the principal, for awards at commencement exercises. Previous policies in schools had ranged from \$60 to \$1,200. A move to increase the amount to \$250 was defeated.

* Approved a grant of \$1,500. to the Royal Ontario Museum to cover the visits to the museum of 3,090 Halton children last year. The grant the previous year was \$600 by one board.

The funeral service was held at the Rumley-Shoemaker funeral home in Acton, conducted by the Rev. D. C. Nicholson of Campbellville.

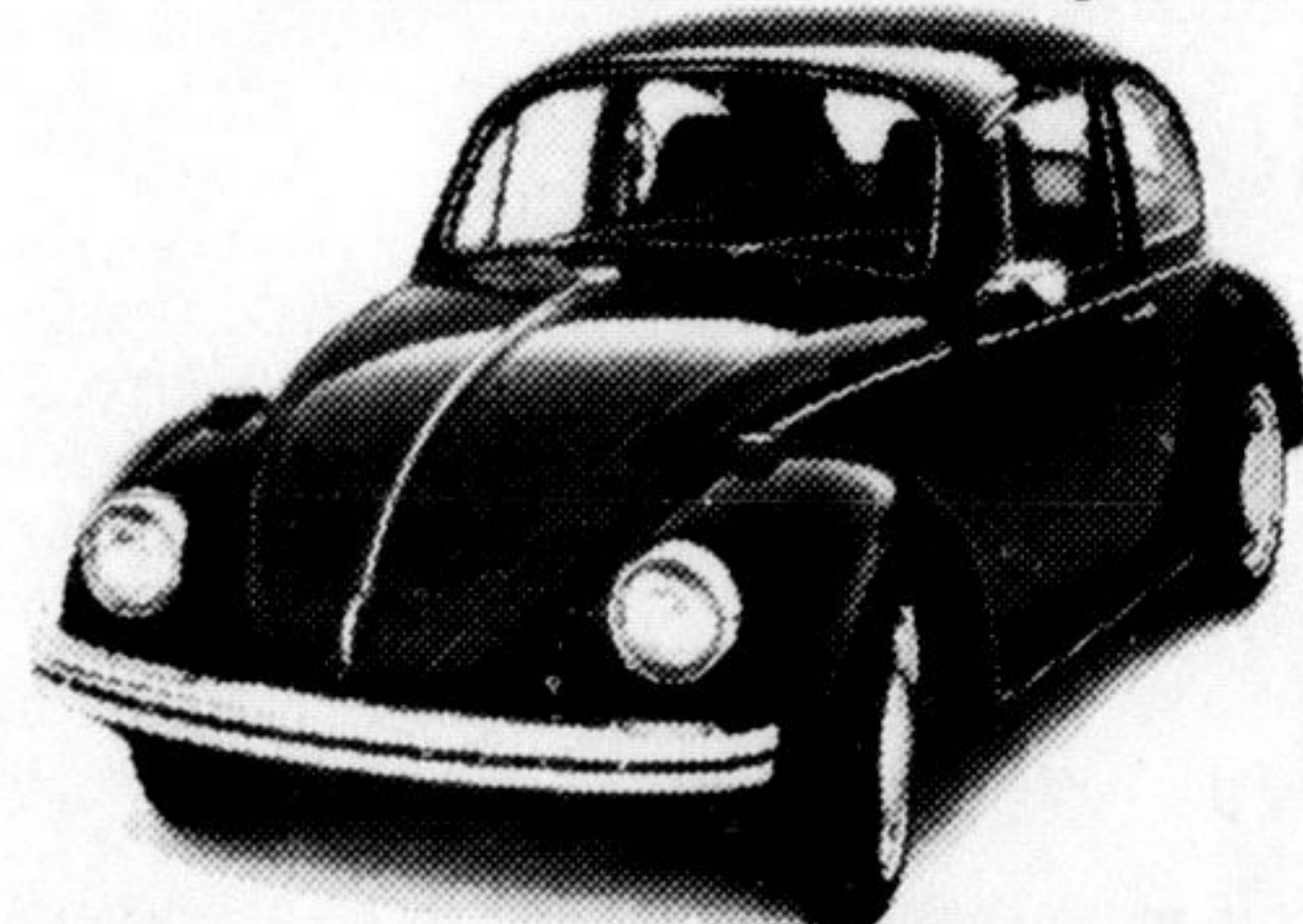
Pallbearers were John Hume, Doug McLean, David Currie, Don Swackhamer, Peter Patterson and Carl Kennedy.

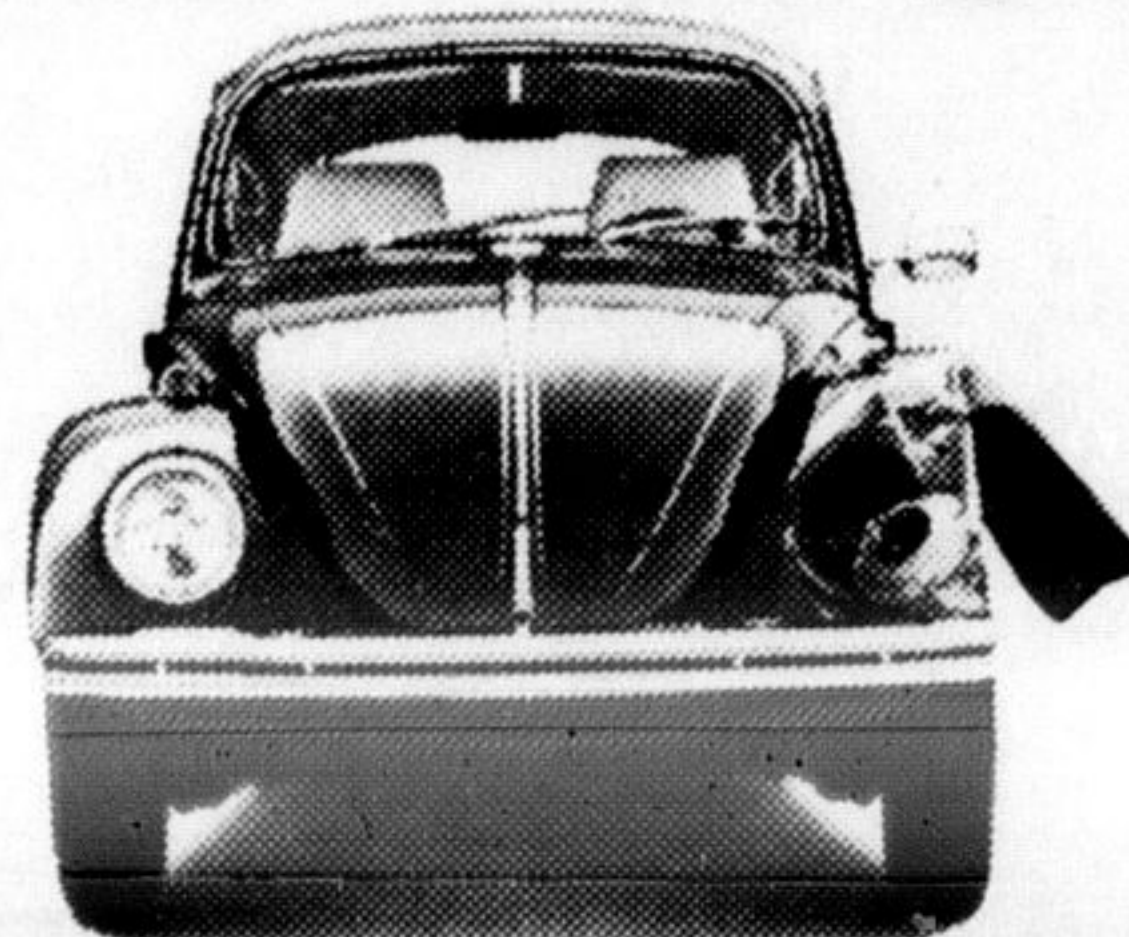
