To drink or not to drink, that is the question. Or at least that will be one of the questions facing Milton voters when they go to the polls Monday, Dec. 1 to elect a new council and decide whether or not the town wishes to have licensed dining rooms and cocktail lounges.

While ministers and the Ministerial Association in town are against more outlets they have organized no campaign against it.

On the other hand the "Vote Yes Committee" is organizing a campaign and doing what they can to encourage voters to cast

votes in favor of the question. They need 60 per cent of the vote to carry it.

Nick Chuchmach said the committee was posting posters about town. They are checking the voters' list carefully, anticipating how voters will go and will encourage those who have not voted to get out and do so. He feels the more people that

vote, the better chance there is of passing both questions.

The committee will be offering car rides to the polls for those not able to get there themselves. Rev. R. W. Foster, Chairman of the Ministerial Association said the group would not campaign but leave it to the people to "vote as their conscience dictates."

Mr. Ledwith has held various posts in the community, is active in the Halton East Liberal Association and was honored as Milton's citizen of the year in 1964.
