His daughter, just turned 21 and graduating from Waterloo University, is accompanying her father to the world's most famous Passion Play, depicting the crucifixion of Jesus, at Oberammergau, in the Bavarian Alps of Western

However, order was quickly restored and a very successful musical evening followed.

An outstanding performance was given by young John Chong who played "Ballad in G Minor" - Chopin. The audience was most appreciative of his talent. The holiday weekend passed with no accidents and a lovely sunny Monday. The children enjoyed fireworks on their own property.

The proposal that M. M. Robinson School is to be the site of another indoor pool is finding much disfavor with the local residents in the north end of Burlington. Residents who pay taxes here and who did not receive a tax rebate are upset that the extra monies held by town council should be used to further more recreational facilities in the town core.

Since residents of the northern part of Burlington do not get sewer, garbage or water service, these were held to be more important than more "fun areas".

In the event that the additional pool was voted on, its location should, in all fairness, be in the area that is not serviced by any transportation so children and adults could avoid themselves of some of the advantages of living in the area controlled by Burlington town council.

The town's recreational committee had better go after that \$70,000 given the "Y" in 1969 to help finance the first indoor pool in Burlington.

In a proposed new agreement the new pool would be available after school hours and on holidays and weekends. It would seem this is easily in the province of a pool situated at Fairview.
