

ESQUESING Township Council BRIEFS

At their final regular meeting of 1970 Monday, Esquesing Council:

-Received a letter from the Department of Mines and Northern Affairs informing them department has no jurisdiction over the location or operation of an asphalt plant to hedge near the intersection of the be built in connection with Third Line and given road to the Dufferin Materials Quarry near Campbellville.
