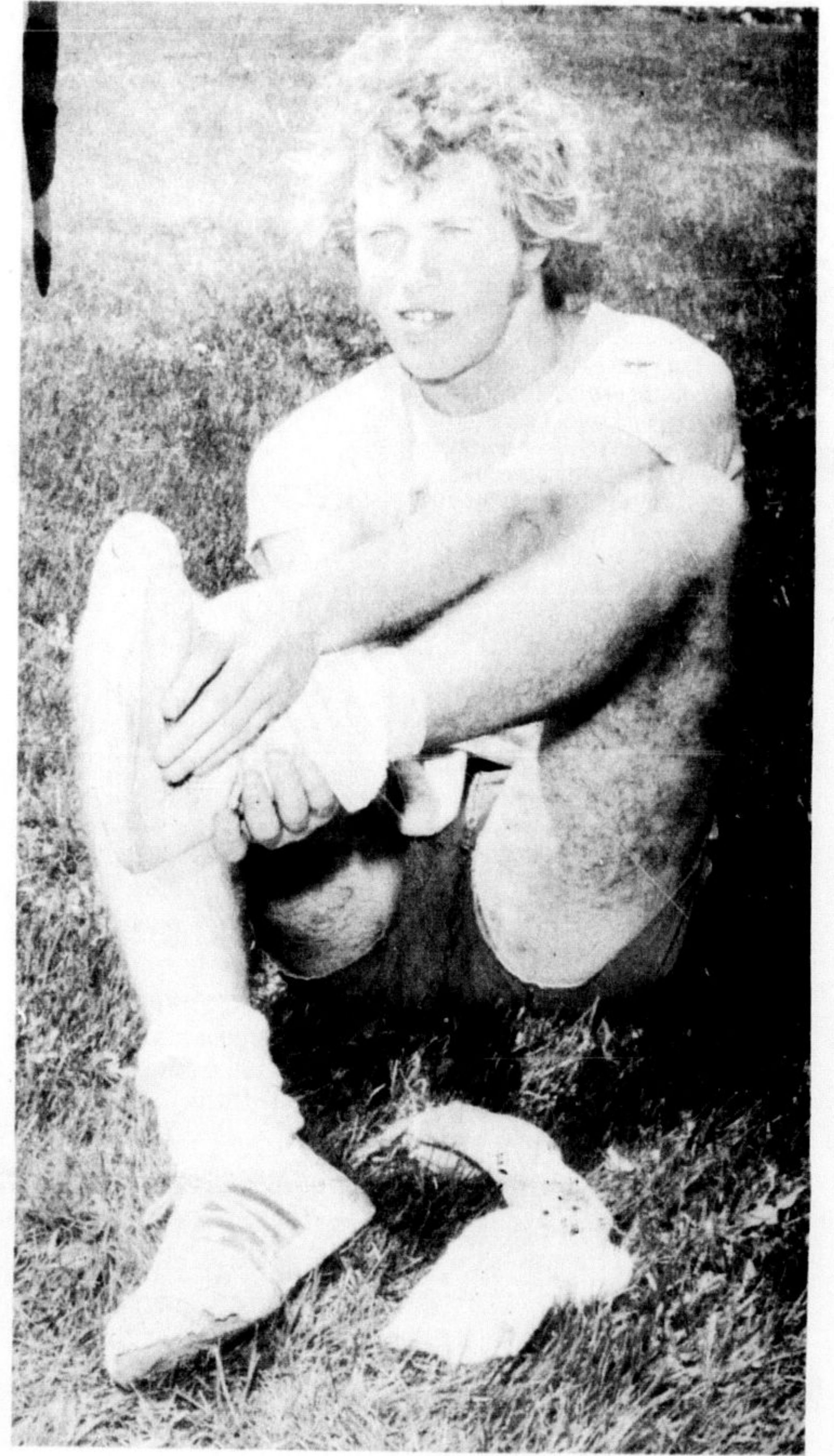

### Welfare blurb for recipients

Subject to committee and county council approval, students from Sheridan College will design and publish folders that the Department of Social and Family

Services will include with cheques and other communications to county welfare recipients.

### Will add 10 students to staff

An additional 10 high school and university students will be hired by Halton Region Conservation Authority this summer under the provincial government's SWEEP program. The Authority had previously been authorized to hire 43 students and further authorization for 10 more is likely to be received, general manager Murray Stephen announced at Thursday's meeting.

As of Thursday 108 applicants had already been interviewed by the Authority's resources manager in training Jim Gosnell. Mr. Gosnell will be heading the program this summer.

Friday was the deadline for applications. Students hired will be working a 40 hour week, concentrating on conservation area projects.

Sheridan has offered the service at no cost to the county. It was thought the family life students would work in conjunction with printing and graphic arts students to produce the folder. The folder would contain budget hints and tidbits of information, Deputy Director R. J. Vivian told the Social and Family Services committee.

Members of that committee expressed a willingness to have the project get underway and asked that sketches of the first folder be presented at the next meeting.
