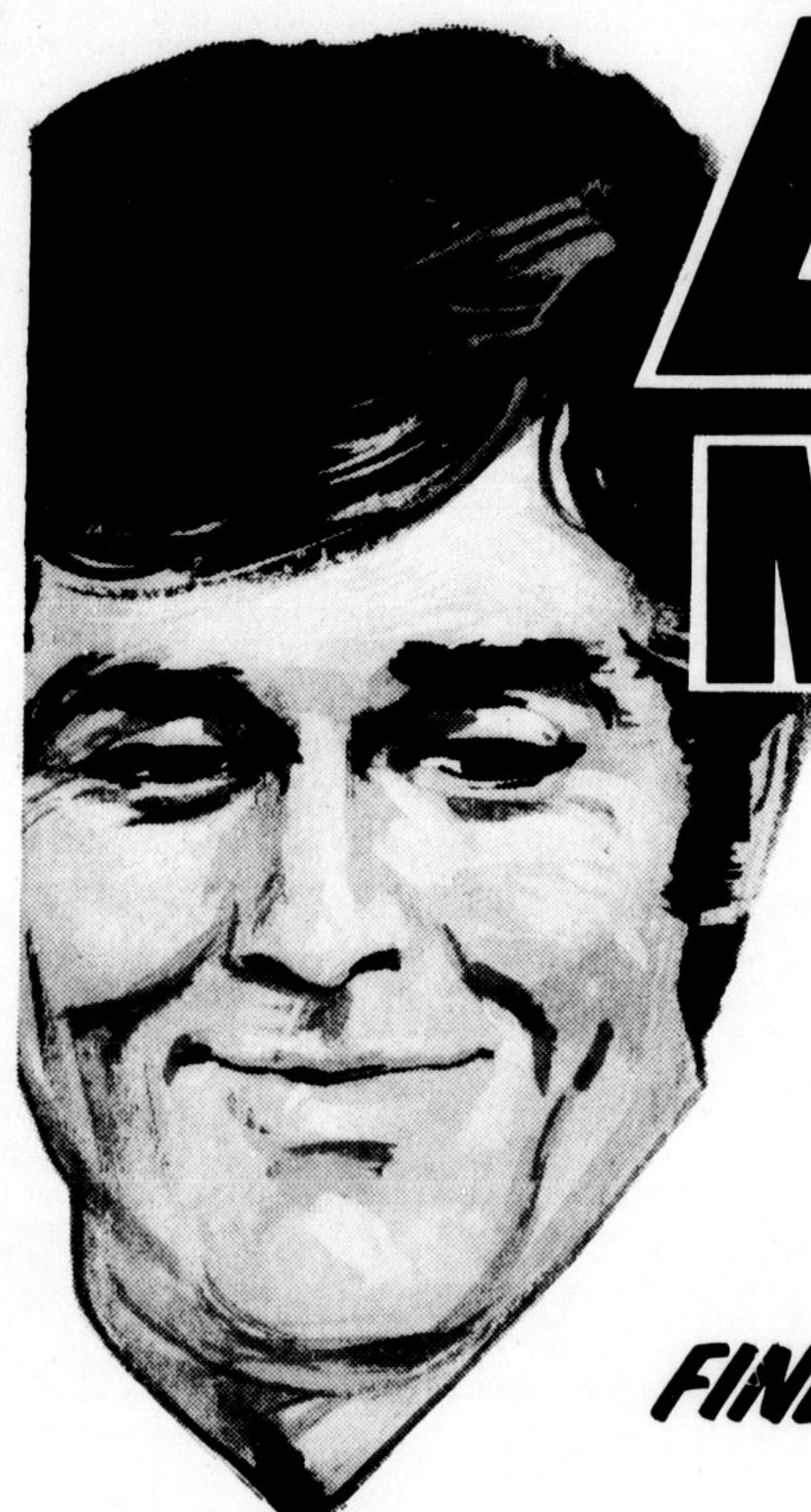
Presentation
