Liberal Leader Robert Nixon is speculating on an Oct. 14 provincial election. While he readily admitted at an Oakville press conference Saturday that all the figuring was based on rumor, he said several things pointed that way. Meanwhile he is touring the

province. "I'm going as hard as I can go now I guess, but you might consider this just leader's summer tour," he said.




