US firm Central Cartage new owner at McKinlays

Instant communication is the name of the game in the transportation business, says McKinlay Transport General Manager Dean Duffey. Duffey was named manager just three weeks ago. He has been employed with the parent firm, Central Cartage Inc.

Central Cartage bought the

Milton-based McKinlay business over a year ago when tight money conditions following a major move by the McKinlay firm forced the Canadian family to sell to the U.S. firm.

Both general manager Duffey and Vice-president of Traffic Ernie Enright were convinced the firm, although owned by Canadians and enjoyed autonomy. Mr. Enright stayed on when the firm was sold but Mr. Duffey left his job with the parent company to come here for the new post.

The firm employs about 90 to 95 in the Milton terminal and working out of it are 500 trucks

controlled from that office. The firm deals in international and domestic traffic.

Pick up now
According to the new manager, business tailed off at the time of the sale. Some layoffs were necessary and some people in management chose to leave for other jobs.

However the trend has reversed and an upward swing has taken over, increasing business and accordingly increasing staff. With 20 terminals in Ontario and trucking rights into the heart of the United States, Duffey says the firm's

limitations are few. Because the parent body owns both American and Canadian trucking firms the points to which their transports can travel are increased.
The firm is currently in the process of pulling old trucks off the road and replacing them with diesel trucks estimated at \$18,000 each. About 60 of the old rigs have been retired since the firm took over last July.

Accept bid sewer line

Milton Council awarded the contract for construction of the Harrop Drive sanitary sub trunk sewer to Vasto Construction Company Monday night. The low bid came in at \$66,803 compared to the high bid of Angellotti Construction that went to \$108,704.

Council noted Vasto promised to have the work done in seven weeks and other bids were as high as 15 weeks before the work would be completed.
