Welfare budget runs short

Halton County's budget for general welfare for 1971 will be depleted by the end of October, Jim Gray, Director of Halton County Social and Family Services told that committee last week.

Gray predicted an additional \$120,000 would be required to get through the year. A total of \$653,000 had been budgeted for that portion of the operation but at the end of July, only 23 per cent of the budget was left.

Other divisions of the Social and Family Services Department appear to be in line with budget expectations. The case load report shows the number of employees on the rolls has increased for the second month in a row. The number of employables on the rolls increased from 169 in June to 176 in July and 215 in August. There were fewer on the rolls in June than any month in the year to date.

Area NDPs roast corn

Federal NDP leader David Lewis was scheduled to speak to NDP supporters from five area ridings at a corn roast held at Boyne Community Centre on Saturday, but was unable to make it. Organizers said Mr. Lewis was called away to Saskatchewan where the NDP is waging a by-election campaign.

Derek Blackburn, Brant riding MP, filled in for Mr. Lewis and spoke informally to a crowd estimated at 300. Halton East NDP candidate Ken Gelok and Halton West candidate Walter Mulkeiwich were among five area contenders introduced to the crowd.

Advise council on new house standards

After a lengthy discussion, Milton Planning Board devised a new schedule of requirements for minimum floor areas in new buildings.

The new schedule as recommended to council requires a minimum of 1,400 sq. feet gross floor area in an R1 zone, 1,500 feet for a storey building and 1,450 feet for a split level.

Minimum requirements
In an R2 the gross floor area must be at least 1,200 square feet

for a single storey building, 1,350 for a storey and a half, 1,500 for a two storey unit and 1,250 for a split level.

In all other residential zones buildings have to be 1,050 for a single storey building, 1,200 for a storey and a half and 1,250 for a two storey dwelling with a minimum of 1,100 for split level.

The planners also recommended that the definition of gross floor area should exclude basements in the case of residential dwellings.

Mulkeiwich's request denied by board

NDP candidate for Halton West, Walter Mulkeiwich approached the Halton County Board of Education of which he is an employee to ask for a leave of absence with pay so that he could devote part of his time during the day to campaigning until the Oct. 21 election.

Mulkeiwich said he couldn't consider taking a lot of time off without pay. He said there were precedents and noted by freeing him to campaign, the board would be helping the electoral process stay in working condition.

summed up the feeling of the majority of the board members when he suggested the leave of

absence be granted, but without salary. Trustee Hugh Clohey did not favor a leave of absence at all.

Trustee Doug Palmer, a teacher himself, felt the request should be granted with salary. The board agreed the leave could be granted without salary.
