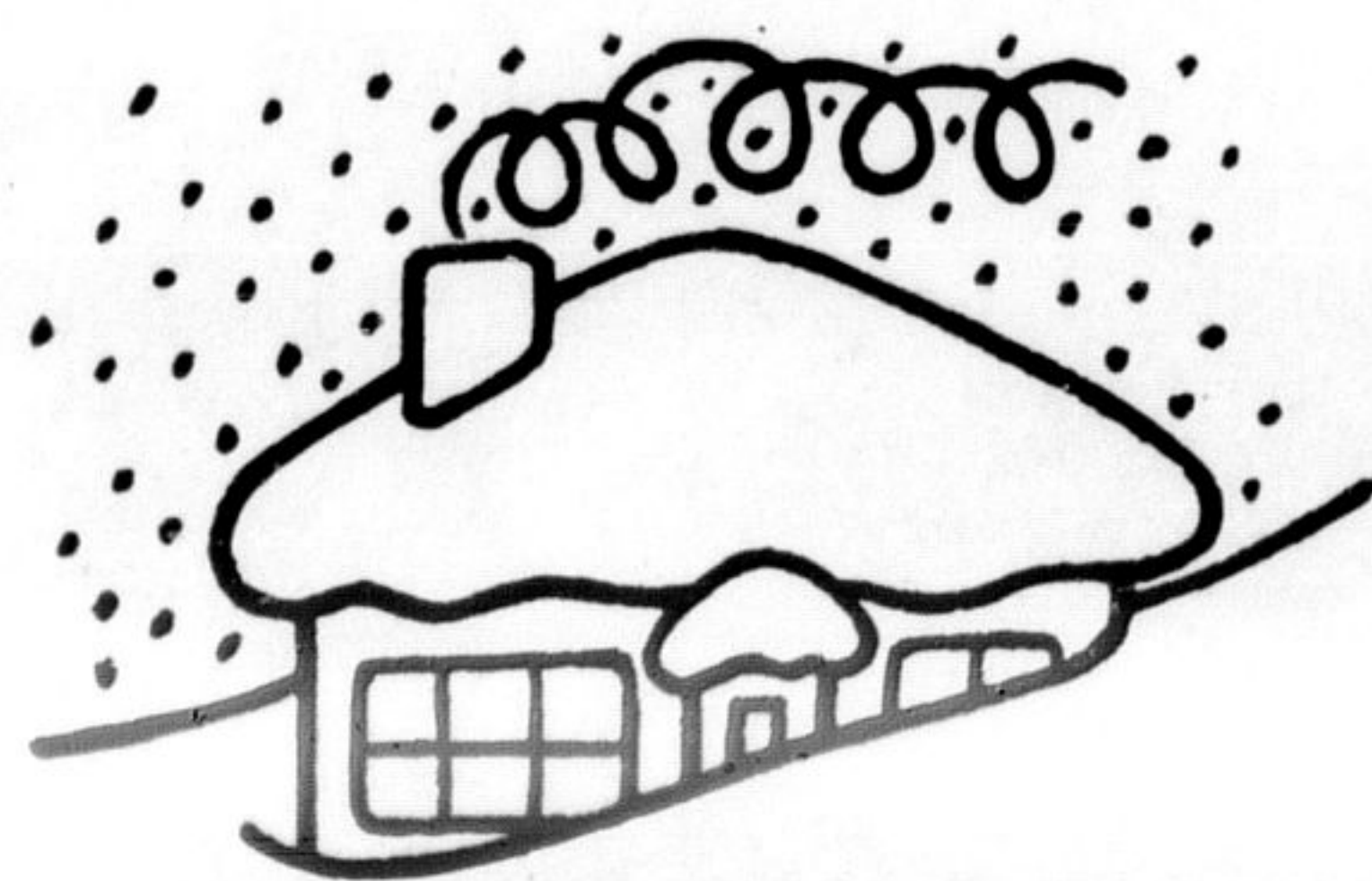
Mrs. A. Ledwith met with several representatives from local churches as well as a member of Milton's Senior Citizens Club to discuss every angle involved. "We feel it would
