

# Wild pigs cause havoc neighbors tell council

After almost five years of frustration trying to work out some solution to his neighbor's wild pigs that run through his and neighboring properties Ken Robinson appeared before Nassagaweya Council at their regular meeting Monday.

He was complaining about J. Snookie who lives on the Guelph Line near 15 Sideroad. He said the pigs were a public nuisance and had done damage to his property and his neighbors' crops.

He and Peter McIlwraith, a second neighbor charged the man wasn't feeding his own pigs. McIlwraith said he had tried everything short of a shotgun to catch the pigs when they came on his property.

**Not fenced**  
Mr. Robinson said it was impossible to catch the pigs. He said they had hundreds of acres to run in and the owner never fenced them in. He said he has considered taking private legal action but learned it would cost at least \$1,000.

Mr. McIlwraith said he was in the process of taking legal action against the man. He said he was worried about his children's safety.

Clerk Campbell Thompson said he had been there to investigate on one occasion and almost hit

one on the road on his way to the farm.

Members of council agreed the pigs on the road constituted a public nuisance and considered passing the matter to their lawyer for advice, but decided to speak to the owner of the land.

Mr. Snookie rents the land. "If it was me, they'd slowly disappear," councillor Jim Watson said.

Mr. McIlwraith said police warned him that it was illegal to shoot a hooved animal but indicated there was no action they could take unless one was caught off the owner's property.

## Want stone from township for unique Founders' Day cairn

Gus Goutouski, chairman of Nassagaweya Founders' Day Committee presented an outline of his plans for the celebration to be held in May, during a meeting of council in Brookville Monday.

He said a cairn would be constructed with a stone from every farm in the township and stones from various parts of the world. The plan is to have children representing various

ethnic groups place the stone from the country they represent. Stones from the farms would ensure complete involvement, Mr. Goutouski said.

The pyramid-styled cairn will be placed in front of the township hall and will commemorate the township's history. Members of council said they like the international flavor Mr.

Goutouski and his committee had created in their efforts.

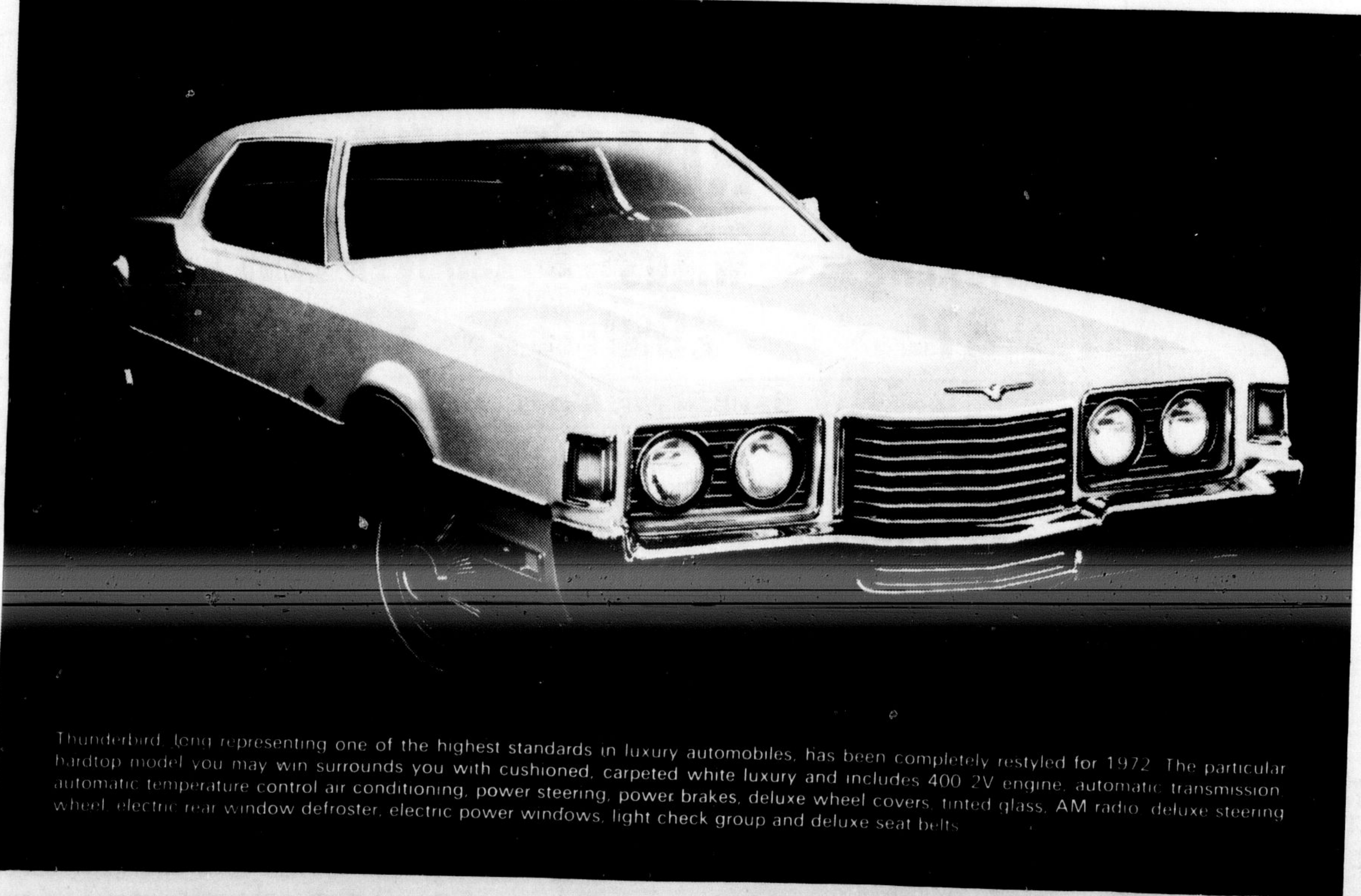
