International plowing match at Jarvis farm this weekend

This week the 1971 edition of the International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Demonstration is being held at Harewood Acres near Nanticoke in Haldimand County. A Burlington man, Jack Taylor heads the Ontario Plowmen's Association which is sponsoring the match and displays in co-operation with the Haldimand County Local Committee.

The match runs from Tuesday. Oct. 12 to Saturday, Oct. 16 and there are highlights each day of the match — both on the fields where plowmen will compete with horse-drawn and tractordrawn plows, and in the 75-acre tented city where the various implement manufacturers and suppliers show off their wares.

Steam equipment Everything from automobiles to farm and home

supplies, appliances, snowmobiles and other recreational items will be on display at the tented city. There's a daily noonhour parade through the city, cooking and Ontario senior champions will be fashion shows and even some antique steam-driven farm equipment in operation. 




