

**Damage toll \$2,300**

**Trucks collide on 25**

A two-truck accident resulted in an estimated \$2,300 damage Friday. The accident occurred on Highway 25, north of the Base Line in Milton. Police report there was \$300 damage to a dump truck driven by Peter Klotsooulos of Downsview. The second truck, driven by Giuseppe Marchese of Toronto received \$2,000 damage.

Milton Police had to investigate a rash of accidents in the past week. A parked car owned by Dick Richardson of R.R. 1, Dundas was involved in a collision with a bulldozer at the Polymer Corporation plant site on Third Line, Wednesday. The bulldozer, which is owned by Finley McLachlan Ltd. of Toronto, was driven by Douglas Robertson of Scarborough. There was \$400 damage to Richardson's car.

**Cars collide**

The same day there was an accident on Ontario St. near the Base Line. First vehicle was driven by Katherine Patrick of Burlington. The second car was driven by Edith W. Sharpe of 429 Pearl St. Milton. Damage to the Patrick car was \$177; to the Sharpe auto \$250.

A Guelph man and two Milton residents were involved in a three-car collision Friday at Main and Charles Sts. Ken Marshall of Guelph suffered \$200 damage to his car. The second driver was Rito Martine of 11 Third Sideroad, who received \$1,300 damage to his vehicle. The third auto was driven by Eddy Vanderheyden of 237 Tremaine Road. There was \$85 damage to Vanderheyden's car.

Another accident Friday this one at Mill and James Sts., involved vehicles driven by Frank Janknegt of R.R. 2, Campbellville and David M. Hobson of Nassagaweya Township. Damage to the Janknegt car was \$200; to the Hobson vehicle \$500.

**Two in one day**

Milton Police report two accidents Saturday. Howard Wrigglesworth of 133 Mill St. Suffered \$700 damage to his car, after a collision with a parked car on Heslop Rd. Owner of the parked car was Barry W. Clements of Brantford. There was \$500 damage to his vehicle.

Saturday's second accident occurred on Main St. The first driver was James R. Shields of 282 Martin St., whose car suffered \$400 damage. The second car, driven by Edith W. Sharpe of 429 Pearl St. received \$50 damage.

There was a three car accident Monday morning on Base Line Rd. in front of the County Building. The drivers involved were Johannes Kowl of R.R. 3, Georgetown, Ingrid Job of 247 Elmwood Cresc. and Pietro Tonelli of 37 Fruit Line. **ARCO speaker predicts death of county gov't.**

"County government in Ontario as we have known it is dying of natural causes. It will be dead in 20 years."

So said Donald L. King, in opening the 12th annual conference of the Association of Counties and Regions of Ontario, held at Sarnia.

Mr. King a principal with Stevenson and Kellogg Ltd., management consultants, suggested to some 200 delegates that the future of the Association depended on the initiative individual counties took in strengthening their own futures.

Referring to the ACRO booklet "Guidelines for Action", he said, "It's a good booklet. Now it has to be turned into action—and much of the leadership has to come from the people in this room". He emphasized that counties must change—or provincial government will usurp their role.

Mr. King identified the areas of change as being planning, development, boundaries, the county warden's job, the financial base, and rearrangement of responsibility for services. To effect these changes he recommended that individual counties should:

1. Strengthen county administration;
2. Develop an official county plan that integrates with plans of local municipalities;
3. Undertake co-operative programs with nearby cities;
4. Approach new problems with

new and fresh ideas and an open mind.

The role of the Association was defined as one of giving leadership to the development of strong second-tier government. "ACRO developed the Guidelines booklet," said Mr. King in closing, "and ACRO should see that it turns into action."

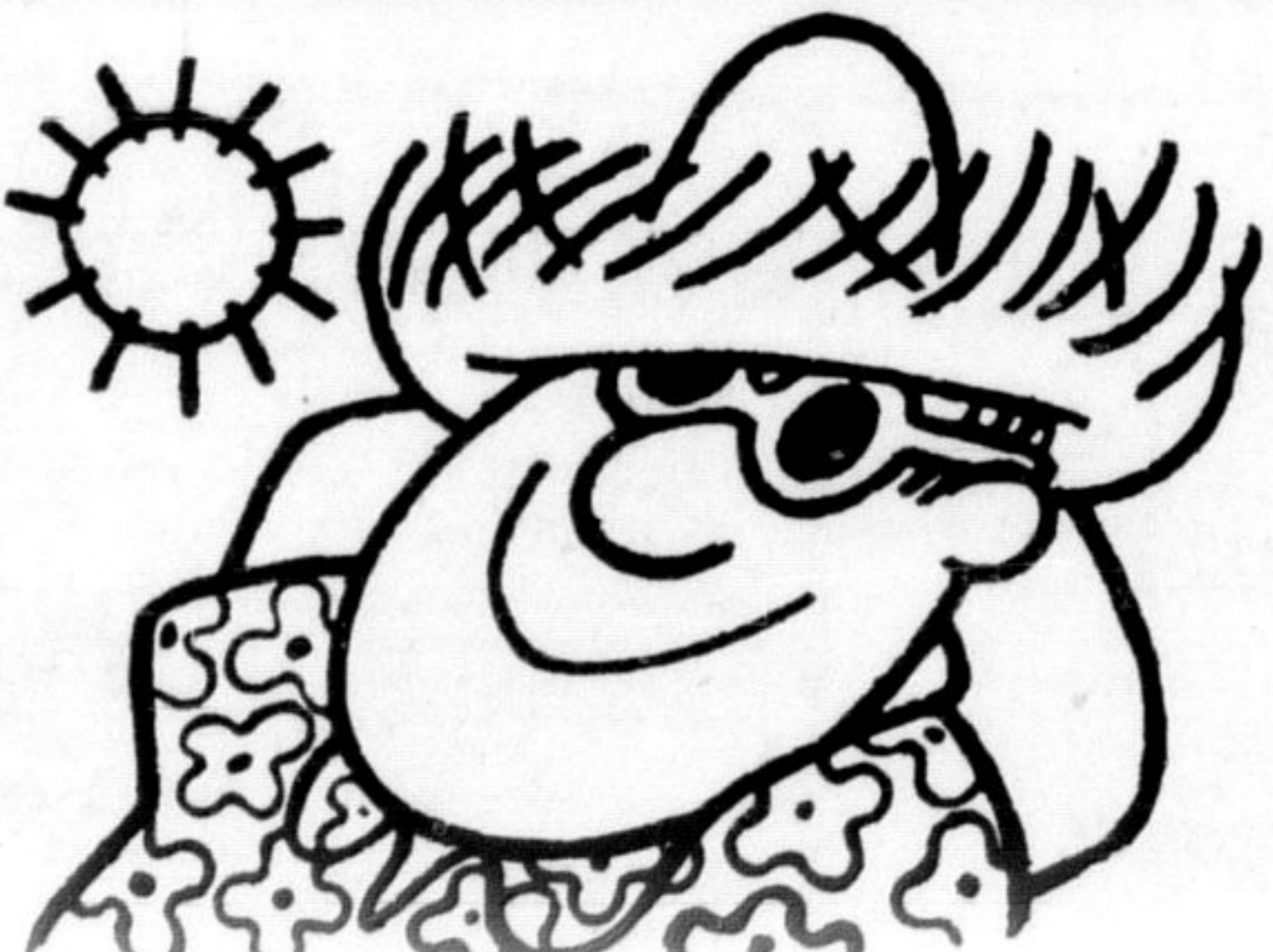
"I don't think the rug was taken for personal gain. It was probably more of a childish prank," remarked Chuchmach. "There was probably more than
