Nation-wide scheme to put PCs in power

A Canada-wide game plan is underway and is geared to put Progressive Conservatives in power at Ottawa, Don Mathews, Canadian PC president told Halton Conservatives Wednesday at their nomination meeting in Oakville.

"We'll have the best advertising and publicity campaign ever. Our message will be in every paper, on every billboard, television and radio," he said.

Mathews promised help for every region from Tory headquarters. He said every candidate would be in day to day touch with national headquarters for praise and criticism. "If we're not big enough for

criticism, we're too small for praise."

He said the Conservative victory would end the first term of a Canadian President and hopefully the last. He criticized the prime minister for trying to keep too many things secret. He said that Pierre Trudeau considered a leak would otherwise be known as a standard press release.

"He fears leaks because he knows it will be his cabinet that sinks," Mathews said, noting that if many other Liberals crossed the floor of the Commons it would soon be up to Bob Stanfield to call the election.

He held Trudeau responsible for the 650,000 persons unemployed and the human suffering involved. "He must be held responsible for using outdated tactics that result in human suffering."

"The shiny public relations veneer is breaking and the real man is emerging. Trudeau put his record in box and polished the box, but inside there is nothing."

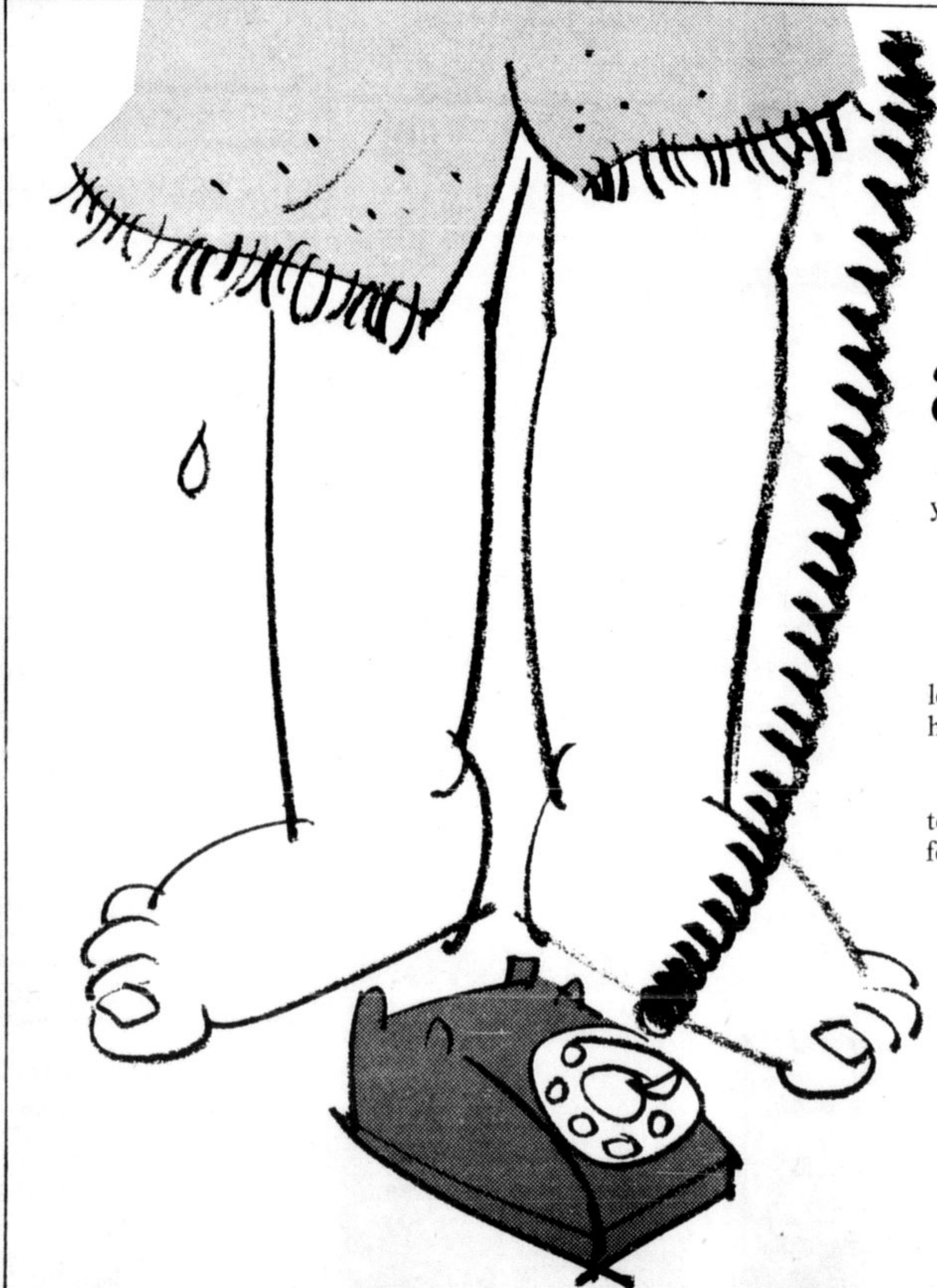
