

Midget title is on the line

The O.M.H.A. Midget Final series between Milton's Dufferin Quarries and Collingwood is all tied up at two wins apiece as the host Collingwood crew edged their Milton visitors 6-5 in an overtime thriller Saturday afternoon.

Brian Boyce put the winners in front after only 38 seconds of the opening period and then five minutes later, John Leal gave Collingwood a two goal lead. Andre Wysman brought Milton closer on a pass from Ron Rowley at the 6:17 mark but Glen Boocher put the Collingwood crew ahead 3-1 to end the first period.

A scoreless second frame followed and then after almost two minutes of the third period had been played Ron Rowley narrowed the gap as he completed a drive with Andre Wysman on a play that Tony Pedulla started. Boyce fired his second goal of the game at 17:26 to give the hosts a 4-2 cushion.

Dave Robertson drew Milton within one goal as he dumped in the third goal with only 56 seconds left. Then with Kevin Hood out in favor of an extra attacker, Ron Rowley got his second goal of the game to tie up the contest with only 23 seconds showing on the clock. Pedulla and Wysman helped set up the goal.
