

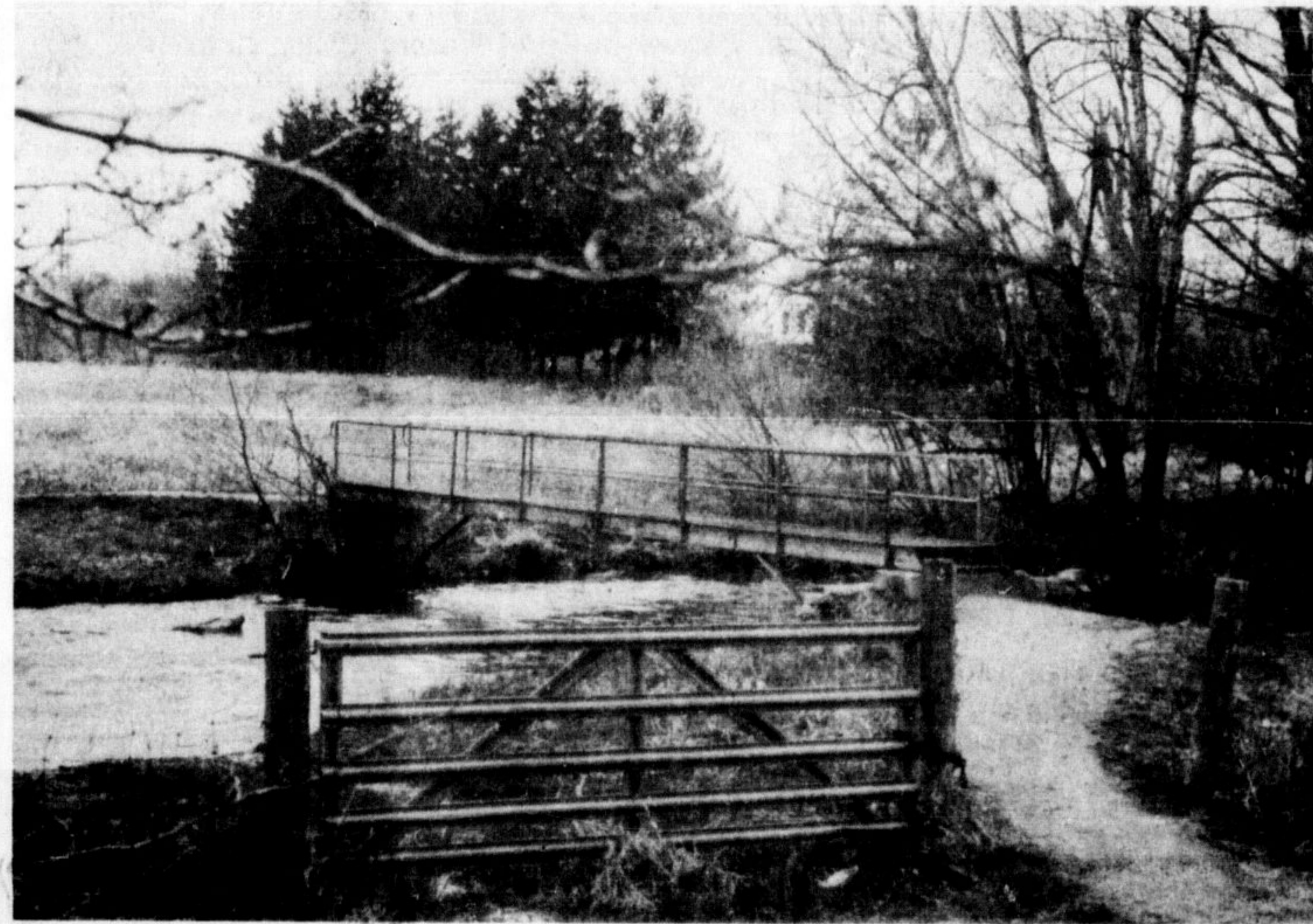

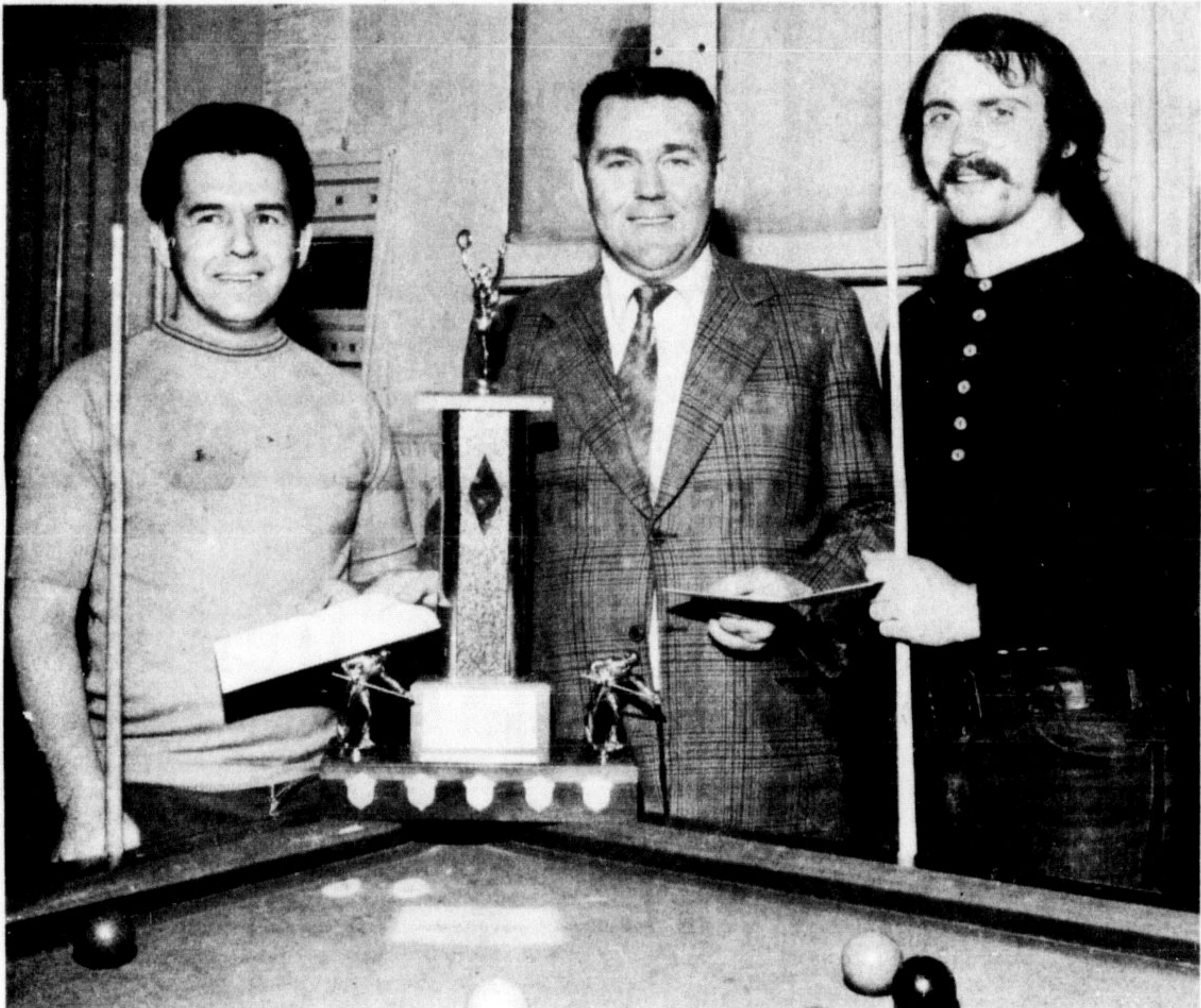

**Second student chosen for summer B.C. exchange**

An Esquering girl has been chosen as the second student from Milton District High School to take part in this year's Young Voyageur trip.

Margaret Robinson, 16, of R.R. 3, Georgetown will be taking an expense-paid trip to British Columbia from July 25 to Aug. 9.

The Young Voyageur program, which was initiated in 1964, is sponsored by the Department of Education in co-operation with the Travel and Exchange Division of the Federal Government along with the other provinces and territories. The purpose of the program is to

acquaint students with other parts of the nation.

Margaret, a grade 11 student in the five year arts and sciences program, learned about two weeks ago that the school's grade 11 teachers had judged her the most eligible female student for the program.
