



Only the very best of the people applying for teaching jobs in Halton County will be successful in getting jobs. The Halton County Board has hired about 75 of the 2,400 applicants so far. They may hire as many as 100 or 125 by May 31. Teachers wishing to move have until then to resign.

Of the 1,000 who applied in the east education centre 36 received jobs. About 20 of the 500 who applied in the north and about 20 from the 600 who applied in the west were hired.
