

MDHS girls honor gym instructor

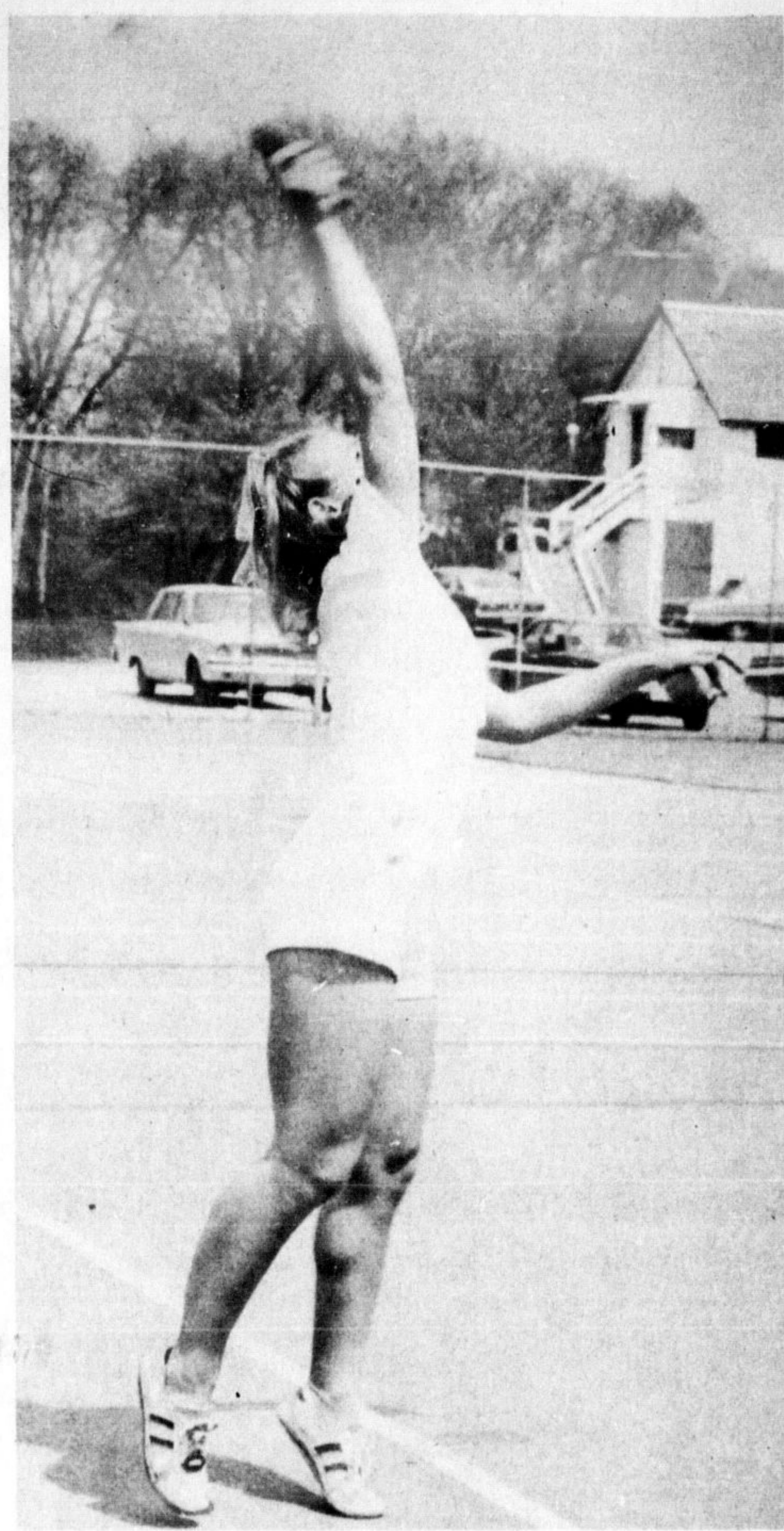
Milton District High School held their annual Girls' Athletic Association banquet Wednesday at St. Paul's United Church. Athletes and coaches were honored at the banquet.

Rare bottles too

Bottle drive success

A booming success was the way Jim Strain described the bottle drive conducted by the 1st Milton Cubs and Scouts Saturday. The group of 25 youngsters and a handful of adults collected two tons of glass and delivered it to Toronto for recycling. In addition to that the group collected close to \$100 worth of pop, milk and beer bottles.

Rare Bottles

Four or five dozen preserving jars were collected and four cases of beer bottles that are no longer manufactured. Strain said it is estimated that the preserving jars are worth about 40 to 50 cents each while the rare beer bottles can be sold for 15

cents per bottle. He said the project served three objectives. It raises money to be turned back into camping trips and equipment, gives the boys something to do and helps residents do their part in recycling. He indicated he would like the project to be carried out twice or three times a year. In addition to this the clubs and scouts are hoping to re-organize the paper drive they once conducted around town. Mr. Strain suggested there would be a need for increased adult and parent involvement in future projects.
