People shouldn't get the idea Milton Council is not doing anything about procuring a site for a new library, Mayor Brian Best said Monday during the regular council meeting. To date council has made three offers to purchase land and "I don't think anyone can charge the council with doing nothing about the library," he said.

Council received a letter from Mrs. W. B. Elsley of R.R. 3, Milton, supporting the need for a new library in Milton. (The letter is published elsewhere in today's edition of The Champion.)

town of Milton will be responsible for about \$75,000 of that total.

Engineers felt it necessary to eliminate the hazardous angle parking spaces on the south side of Main St. between Martin and Brown Sts., so 21 spaces will be lost when the 56 angle spaces are converted to 35 parallel spaces. Eventually plans call for a complete removal of parking from the Main St. but the town's parking authority is not happy about that prospect. Engineers say Main St. should be designed for a four lane road with no parking. A pavement 46 feet wide is planned this year, with sidewalks 8.5 feet wide east of Brown St. and five feet wide from Brown to Bronte Sts.

Just one tree will be removed during the work.

The contractor has been asked to keep a minimum of one lane open to traffic during daytime hours and two lanes in the evening. Shoppers will be urged to use off-street parking spaces during the reconstruction period.
