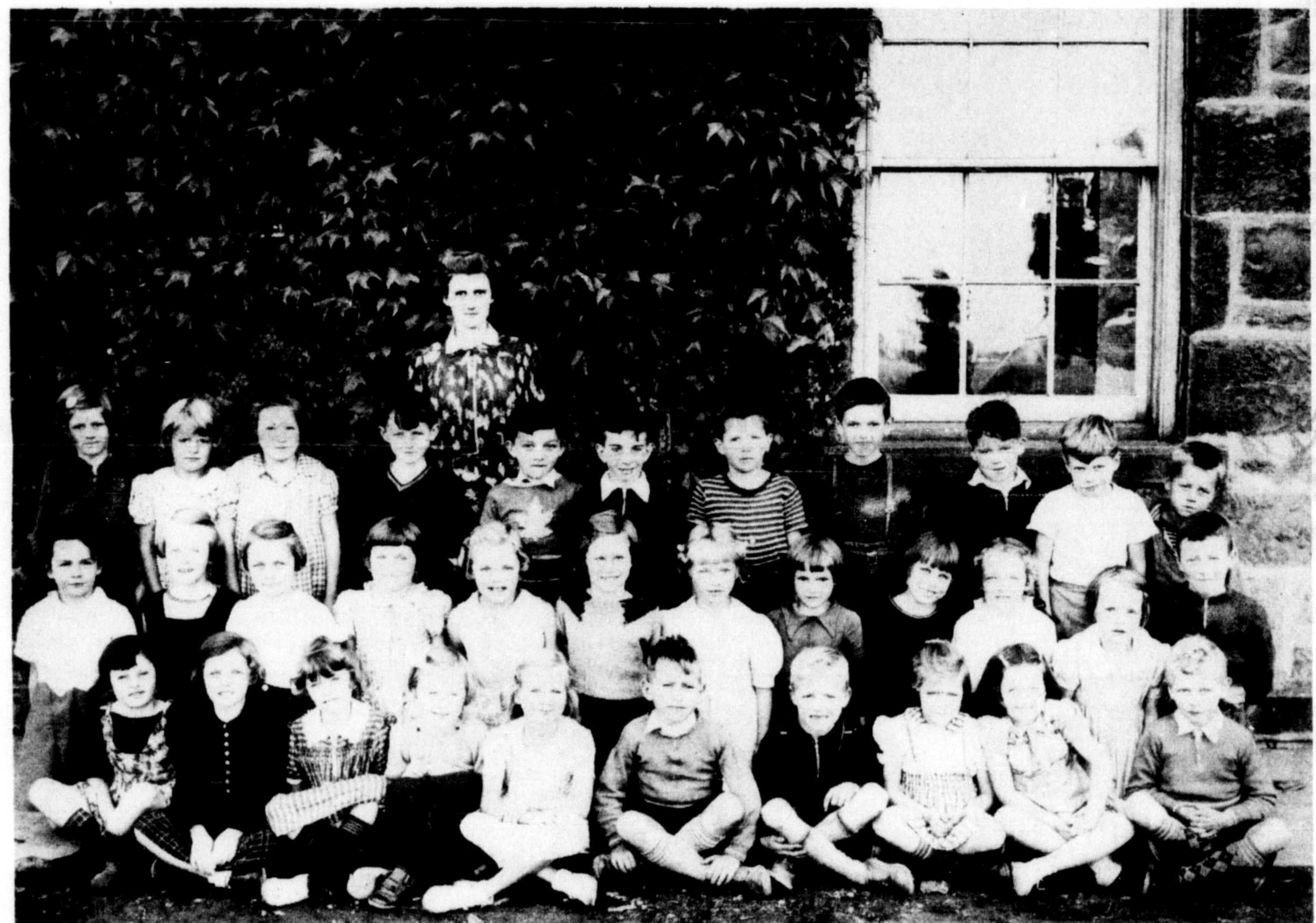

Downtown area scene of week's collisions


