New operator at Kelso horse riding concession

Visitors to Kelso Conservation Area who like to make like Roy Rogers will be able to fulfill their wishes this summer. The horseback riding concession is being operated by new operators, Col. Albert Greco and Mike Cvjetkovich. About 14 horses and four ponies will be available for riding. The horses are being kept in a corral at the west corner of the Park. Charges for riding will be \$3 an hour, \$1 for 20 minutes. **From ranch** Most of the work of caring for the horses will be done by Mike Cvjetkovich, 25, a business student of Ryerson and his wife. Cvjetkovich is maintaining the concession with Col. Albert Greco of the Circle M. Ranch in Woodbridge, where most of the animals come from. If regular patrons are able to treat the horses in a capable and kind manner, then they will be able to ride the animals with very little supervision, says Cvjetkovich. The concession is open every day until Labor Day.

Bill Doole buys Erin weekly

The sale of the Erin Advocate, founded in 1880, is announced by Charles W. Hull, third generation of the Hull family to publish the weekly newspaper. The purchaser is W. E. (Bill) Doole of Terra Cotta, long-time publisher of the weekly Brampton Conservator and its successor, the Brampton Daily Times. The advocate change of ownership is effective July 1.

Mr. Hull, associated with the Advocate since his "printer's devil" (apprenticeship) days in 1942, will devote his full time to other business interests. During the years, Charlie has turned his hand to every phase of the newspaper's operation, and is equally at home in front office or back shop. In news, advertising and accounting, his "Girl Friday" has been his wife Freda.

Doole retired two years ago from the Thomson organization, which operated the Brampton newspaper, formerly a Charters publication, and has since been with the faculty of journalism at the Oakville campus of Sheridan community college. "I just couldn't stay away from the weekly newspaper business—my first love," Bill said, "and, I'm particularly fond of this part of Ontario. I hope to devote some spare time to conservation efforts and will continue as co-chairman of the Terra Cotta and District Preservation Committee."

He began his career as a \$6-a-week copy boy on the Toronto Star, and has worked in various editorial capacities on the Star daily and weekly, the Vancouver Sun, and on Canadian Printer and Publisher.

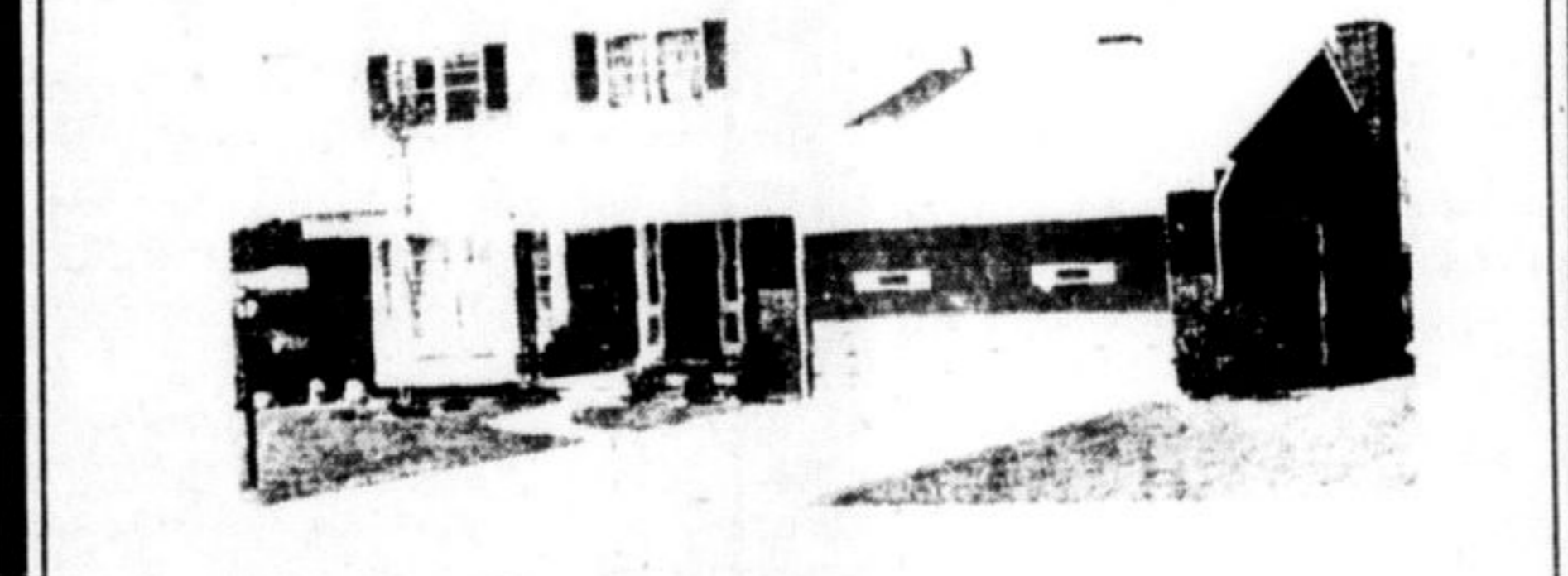

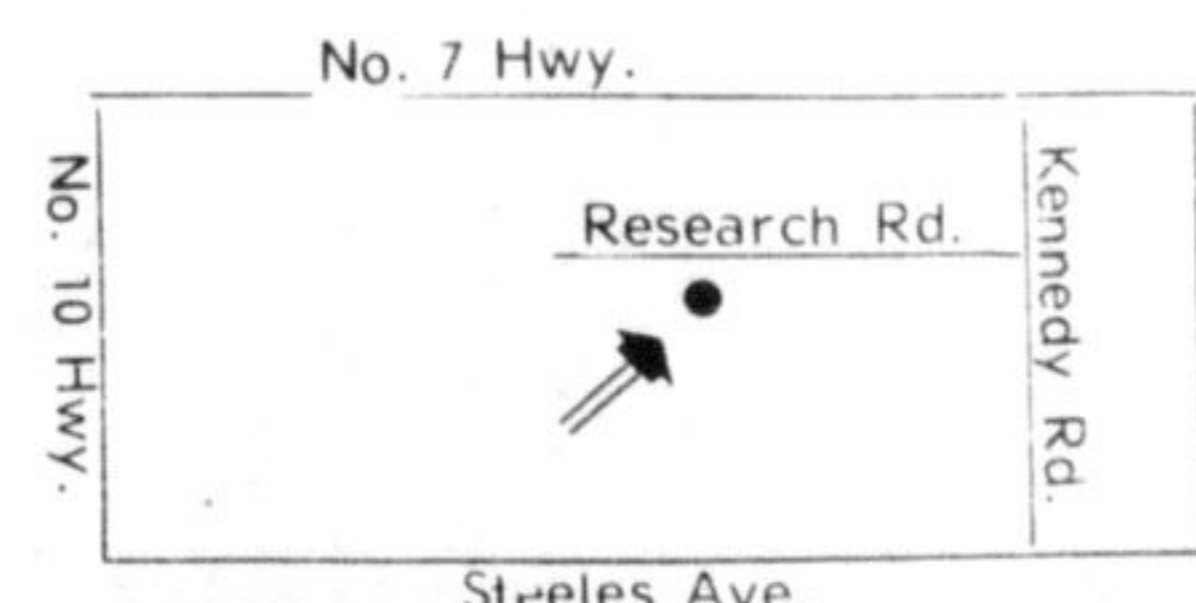
