Octopus-like regenerator manufactured in Milton

People using Nipissing Rd. in the vicinity of the Kingsleigh Industrial Company over the weekend may have thought the industrial lot was the scene of early style science fiction movie. A large protruding

"thing" with arms reaching out from the core was assembled by the plant's employees on Friday. The piece of equipment is a regenerator air grid, according to the owners of the company. Joe Wagner and Cecil Urch. Both men were in similar work before starting up their company in Milton.

The "thing" was shipped to Montreal Monday where it will be used in the BP refinery as a part of a complex mechanical process to breakdown crude oil into its by

products. Wagner says the pipe is made of special materials, such as chrome, to help it withstand high temperatures.

The company makes pressure vessels for the storing and transporting of materials such as oil. The Clarkson and Oakville refineries make up a good deal of the company's customers.

The company, which has been operating in Milton for about seven years has a work force of 13 people; 10 in the plant and three office workers.
