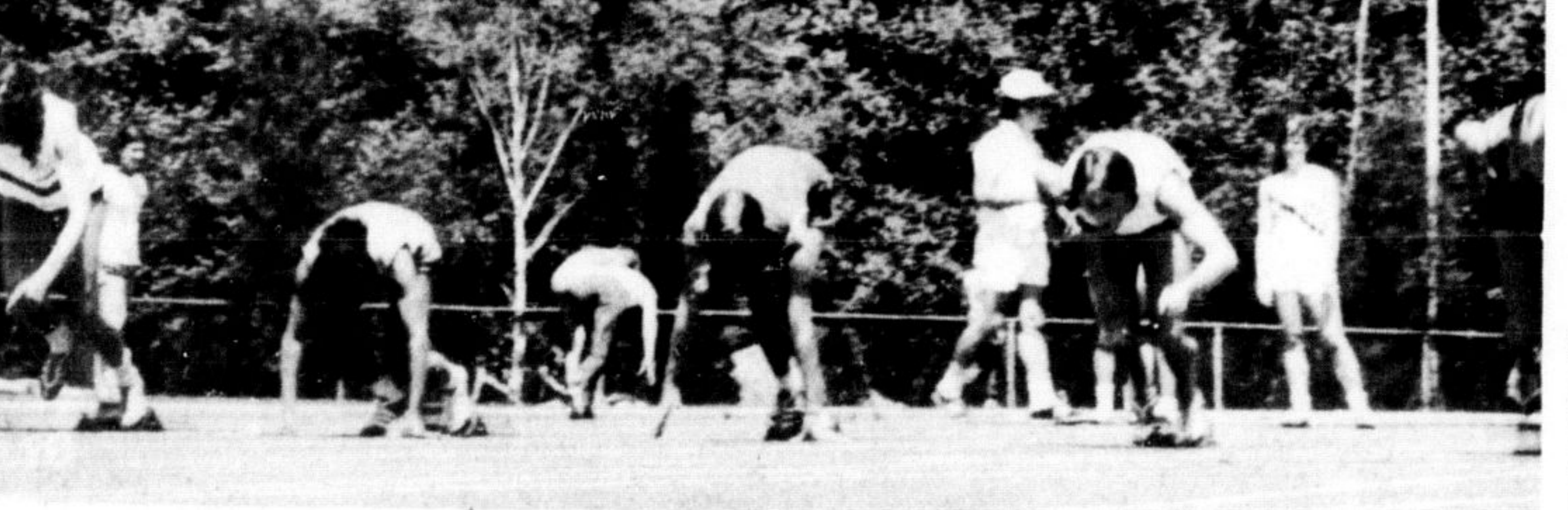
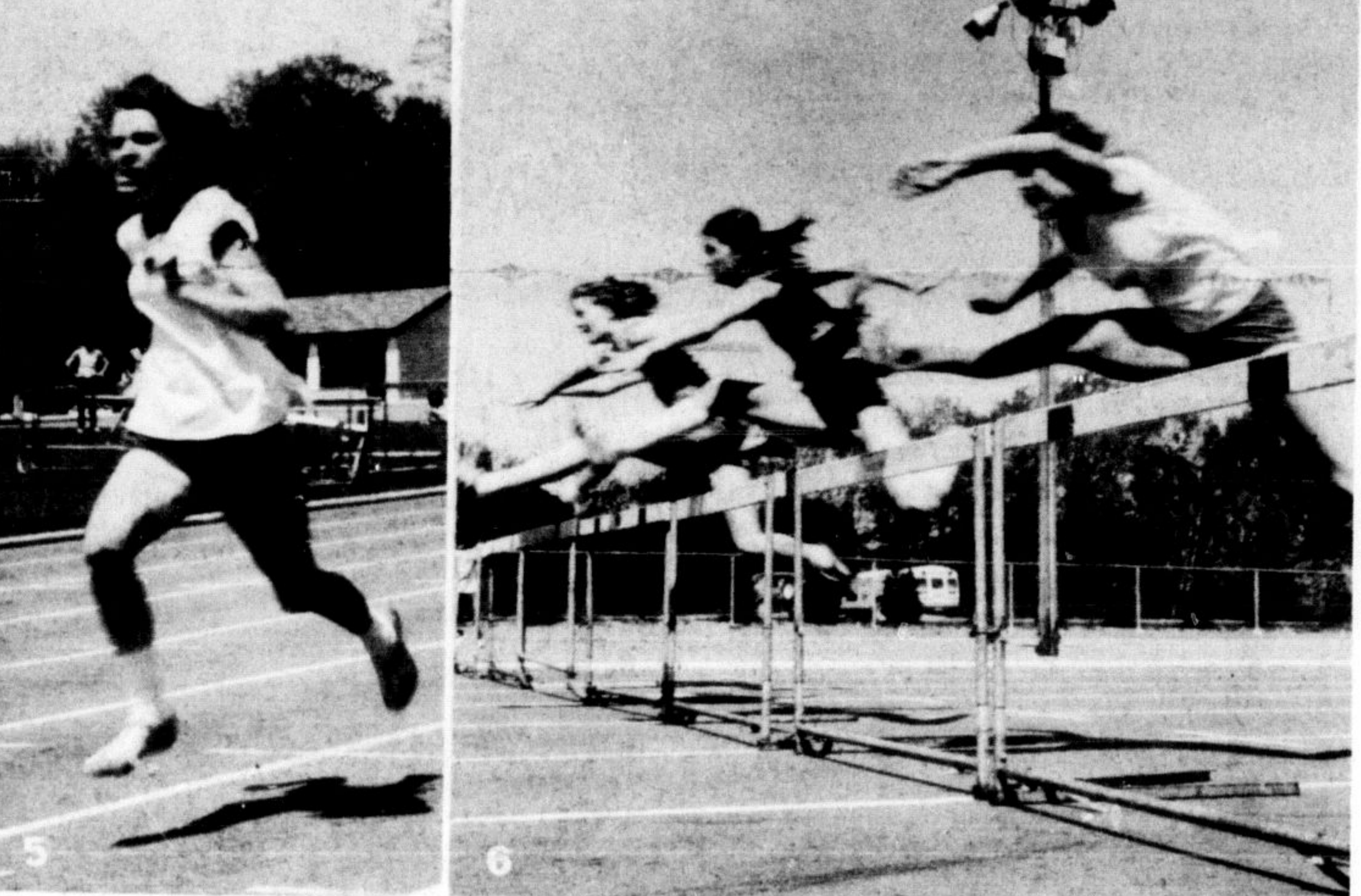

**NAMED TO BOARD**

**CONSIDER "Walk"**  
Milton Council is going to investigate changing the traffic signal at Main and Ontario Sts. to allow a period for pedestrian crossings. Current "walk" lights work with either east-west or north-south traffic but Mayor Brian Best told councillors Tuesday it is a busy corner and getting too dangerous for pedestrians. At the Mill-Martin lights one signal allows only pedestrian movement in the intersection and if it's possible council hopes to do the same at the Ontario-Main corner.
