Plenty of applications for recreation director

More than 12 applications for the town's first recreation and parks director are being reviewed by the Milton Parks and Recreation Committee. At a meeting last week members referred the applications to a committee for study and a series of interviews. Applications have included many from in the province but some as far away as the prairie provinces.

The Committee agreed to engage the Lorne Scots Military Band for a concert in conjunction with the annual July 1 fireworks display at Centennial Park. The band played last year in Rotary Park but another location may be established.

Development plans for the south community and the implications for parks were reviewed by Planning Board Secretary E. R. Pearen. He noted one of the proposed developments did not include a neighborhood park, as suggested in the development study.

Flood plain
Members reviewed the implications of the flood plain land bordering the Sixteen which is included in one of the plans of subdivision, but not in itself scheduled for any development. Members agreed to study the matter further but indicated initially they still favored the development study outline.

The use of facilities at the Milton District High School by a

group of gymnasts during the summer was to be investigated. Proposals for staffing and salaries in the playground and pool were approved by the committee.

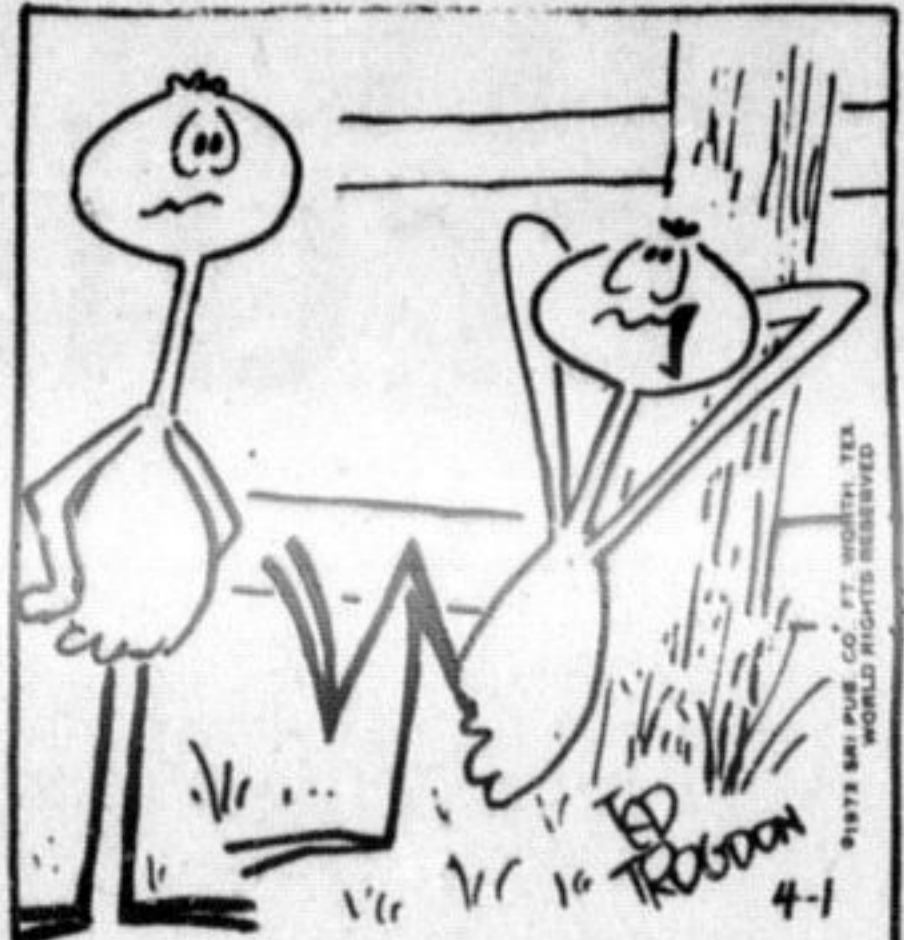
Members met with Works Superintendent Bruce McKerr and Councillor G. Krantz to consider improvements to the road in Rotary Park. The Superintendent noted the road had no base and costs of establishing a proper base this year were to be investigated.

Firefighters chosen first aid champions

A four-man team of Georgetown Firefighters was crowned Ontario's first aid champions at the annual Ontario Open First Aid Competition held at Moss Park Armoury in Toronto recently. St. John Ambulance sponsored the contest.

The Georgetown crew won the senior men's division and overall championship and received a large award—a plaque weighing about 70 pounds. They also won a separate trophy for being the best firefighting group in the contest and each member of the team received a wallet.

three first aid problems. About 100 young people were made up with a variety of injuries, which looked so much like the real thing the armoury floor resembled a disaster area. Tom Massena, Gord Inglis, Bud Hyde and Doug Harley made up the Georgetown firefighters team.

The competition has been held annually for 48 years and is usually won by a team from an industrial plant. Only qualified first aid badge-holders can compete.

Earlier, the Georgetown crew was named first in a casualty simulation test sponsored by the Ontario Fire Marshal's Office and Levitt Safety Supply Co. It was the first time such a contest has been held and there were just four entries—Georgetown was first, Sarnia second by two points, followed by Manitowadge and Puslinch Township. St. John Ambulance instructors judged the teams and Georgetown crew won the trophy.

Say too much math in H.S. science course

An alternative to the current science course in high schools must be evolved if the same high academic standards are to be met, Jack Berry, a member of the Science Program Council and a teacher at T. A. Blakelock High School told the Halton Board of Education Thursday.

Berry said the course for the general course students shouldn't involve as much mathematics' problems as other courses do.

Don't want it
He said some take science because they need it to go into a variety of vocations, not because they want to.

The program council told the board they had written booklets containing supporting material for the science course in the primary division.

A group of four teachers is initiating the development of a

general course for year 11 and/or 12.
