Expecting 2,300 at Sheridan

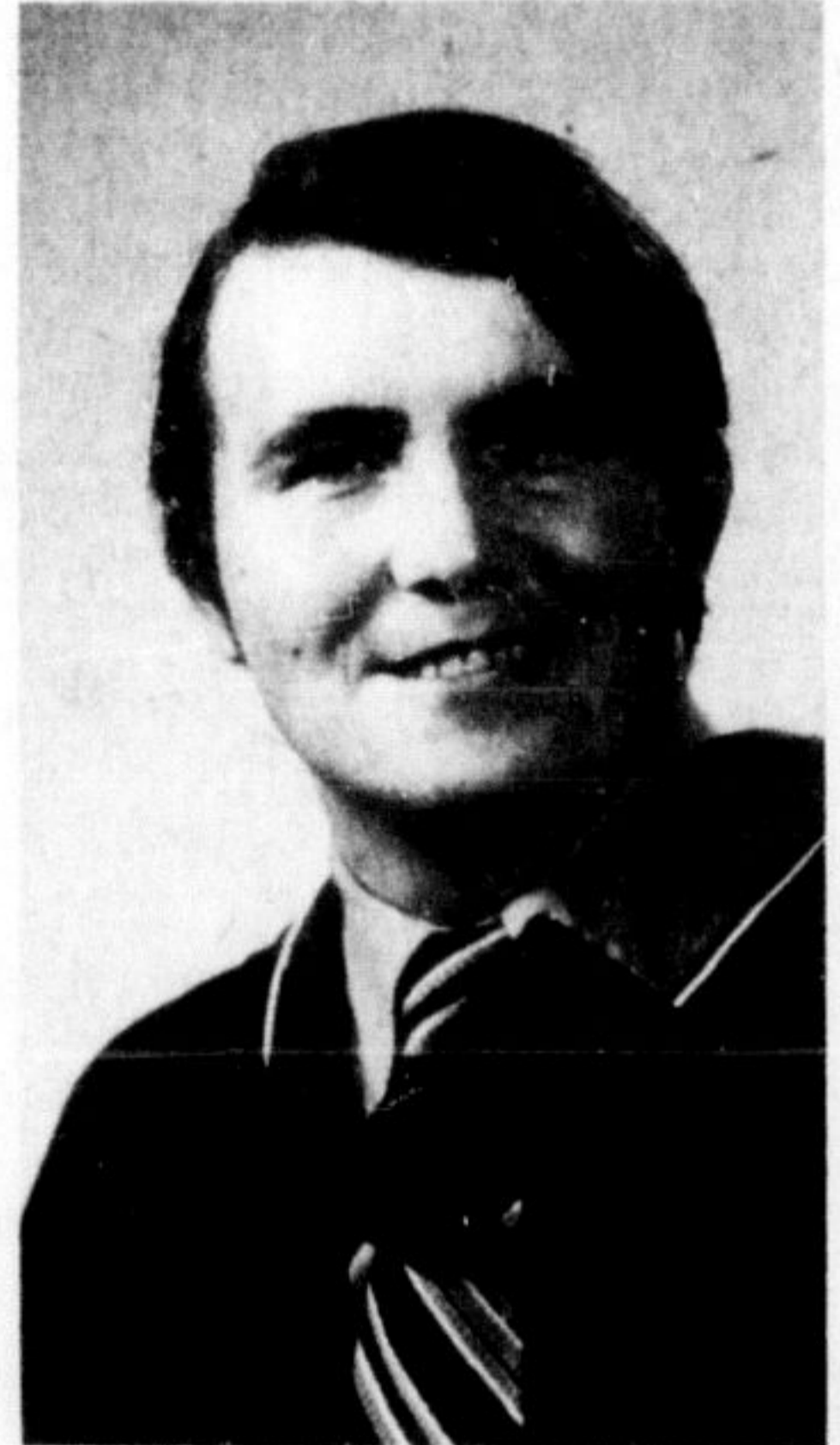

No monetary transactions will be allowed at the Landfill Site—tickets must be obtained at the Town Hall prior to the disposal of any waste material.
