Boudreau and Charlie Cox. Milton defence must accept the blame for not winning this one, becoming slack when the team had a commanding lead.

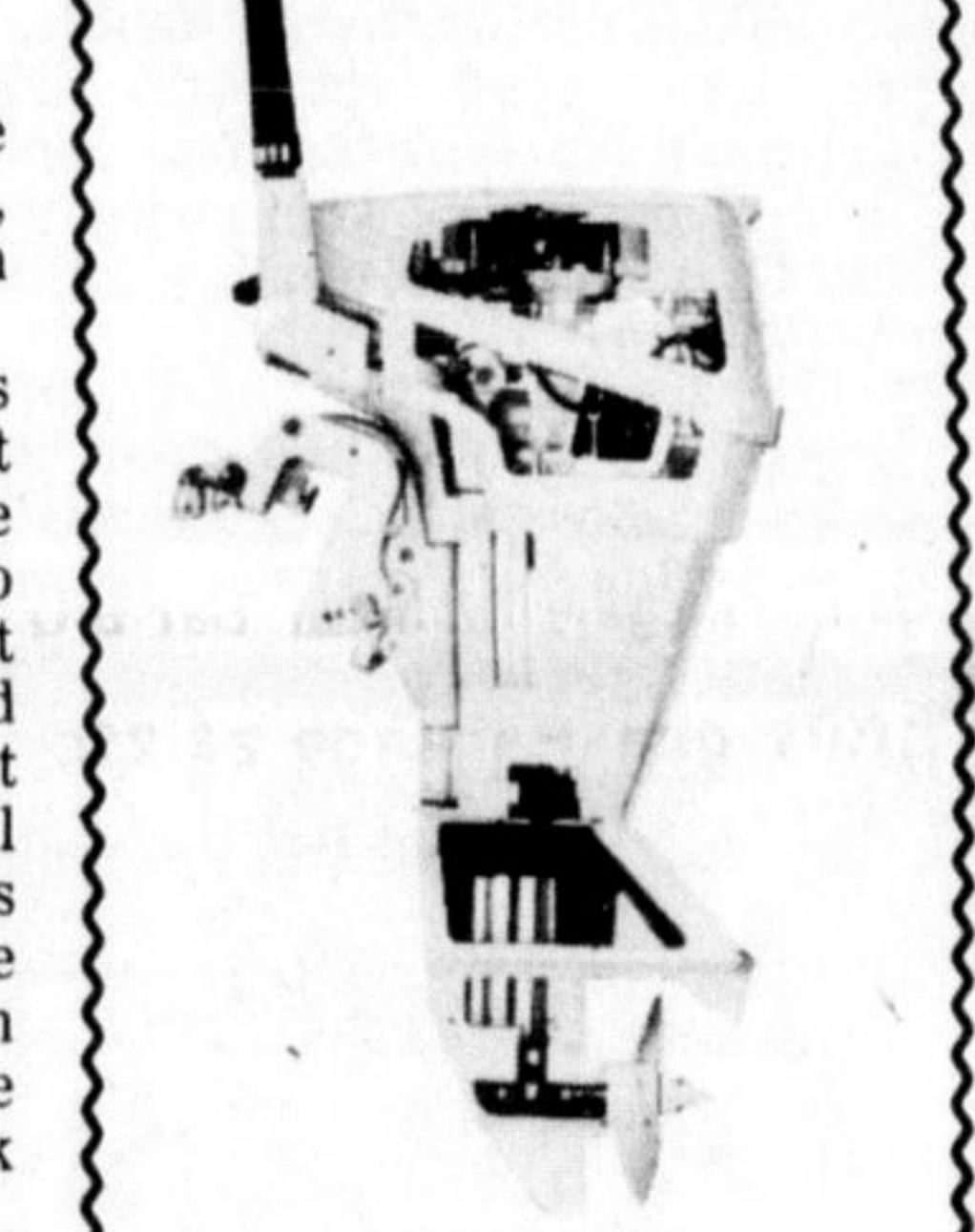
