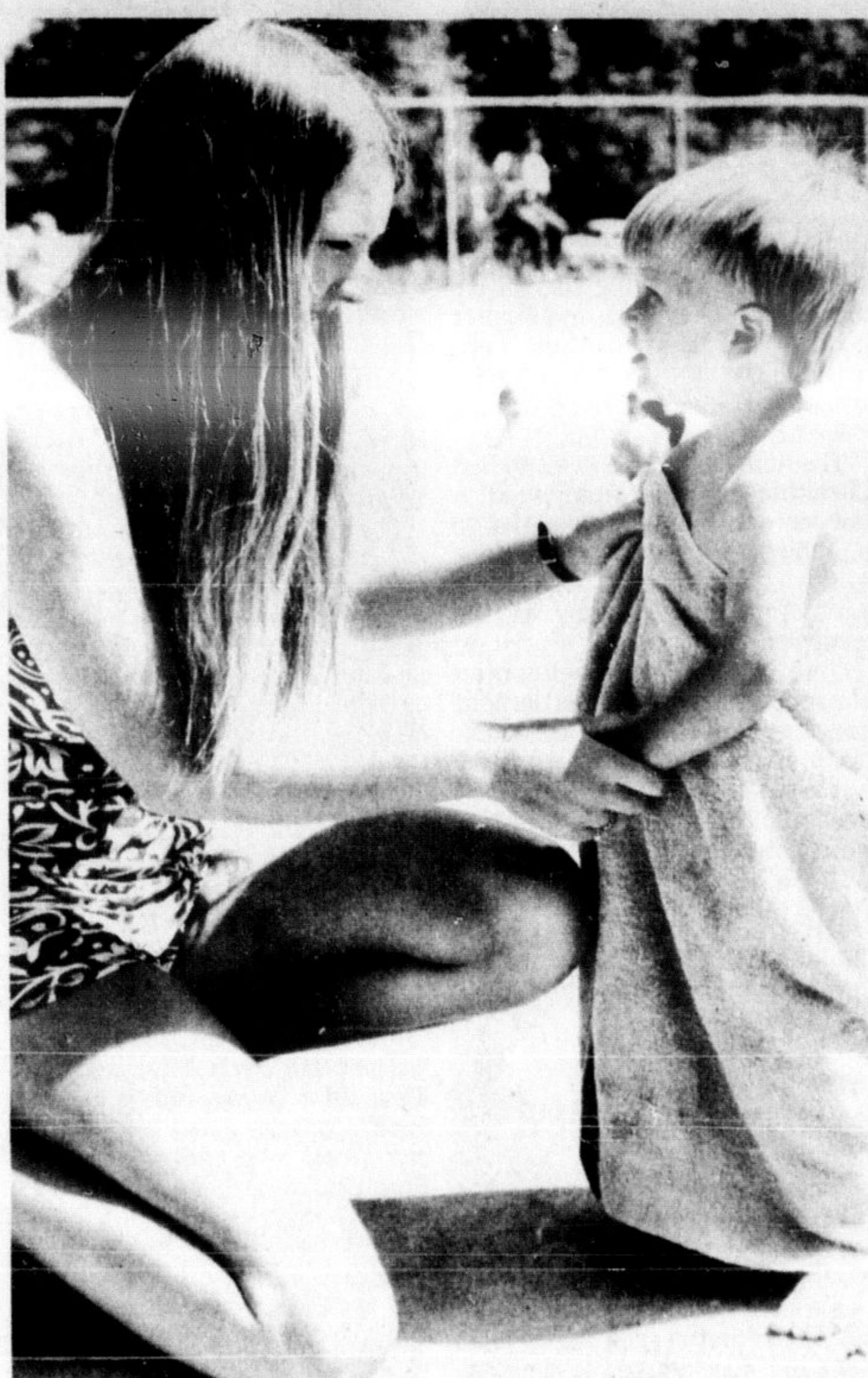

Ebenezer U.C.W. conducts church service

Rev. Witt was the speaker at the U.C.W. annual church service. He had spent 15 years in Nigeria, under the Missionary Church and is now in his fourth year at home, due to trouble in acquiring return visas.

He took as his text, "For a great door and effectual is opened unto me and there are many adversaries." We should lift our vision to the open door for effective service to-day. Southern Nigeria is 4 degrees north of the equator. It is hot all the time, there are two seasons, hot and dry and hot and wet. Missionaries have to adjust to different foods. If the missionaries break the customs, it becomes a barrier.

There are 450 different dialects. Different inflections make different meanings; for instance, there is a very slight difference between an elephant and a hernia operation, or one might accidentally speak of a man marrying a banana. The people are spirit worshippers, a tree or a large rock is considered sacred. There is a general hospital and 15 medical centres. Education in Nigeria is progressing rapidly. There are over a hundred indigenous churches

pastored by Nigerians. Ladies assisting in the service included Mrs. Ward, Mrs. Weideman, Mrs. Joss, Mrs. Hayward, Mrs. McLean, Mrs. D. Early and Mrs. A. Norrish. U.S. visitors Mr. and Mrs. Russell Schemmle and Mr. and Mrs. Edward McGuinn from Wisconsin spent the weekend with Mr. and Mrs. H. Blyth. There will be no church nor Sunday-School services at Ebenezer for the next three Sundays.
