CONVERTS GAS INTO ELECTRICITY

Fuel cells that convert natural gas into electricity more efficiently than the steam generator process have been developed by the Brooklyn Union Gas Company. The only by-products of the process are water vapor and carbon dioxide. The fuel cell converts 40 per cent of the natural gas energy into electricity by an electro-chemical process. Brooklyn Union hopes to be able to provide electricity at prices 10 per cent lower than present rates.

Ontario will spend 150,000 dollars on an advertising campaign to discourage littering. Television, billboards, border crossings and assorted media will be used in the campaign, which will draw attention to the importance of trash cans in litter control.

NASSAGAWEYA Township Council BRIEFS

During a regular meeting recently, Nassagaweya Council:

—Decided not to create a good housekeeping-by-law. During an earlier meeting of council a ratepayer had suggested such a law to control untidy properties. Building inspector S. W. Savage made a study on other municipalities good housekeeping by-laws and learned there were severe problems enforcing them.

—Firmly rejected the creation of a fire training school in the township. A representative of Sheridan College's Heavy Equipment School appeared at the June meeting of Council with the proposal.

—Learned the operators of a pig farm on Appleby Line north of Steeles Ave. had ceased operations. The farm was the source of several complaints from nearby residents who claimed the farm's operation gave off obnoxious odors.

Edgar Lyle Cairns died suddenly of natural causes on July 24, 1972 in Campbellville. He was in his 78th year.

Mr. Cairns is survived by his wife Anne, daughters Elsie (Mrs. Nicholson) of Millgrove, Lyla (Mrs. Dales) of London and son Earl of Burlington.

Mr. Cairns resided at R.R. 2 Campbellville where he had lived all his life. He was born on Dec. 16, 1894. His parents were Sam and Mary-Jane Cairns.
