

## Bantams are still in contention

Campbellville Bantams stayed in contention for the fourth and final playoff position by picking up three more points last week. On Monday, Dan Thomson battled league leading Oakville to a 6-6 tie, and Dan Baynton gave up one run on four hits in a 6-1 victory over Streetsville.

Thomson scattered 12 hits but gave up only two earned runs in the tie with Oakville. Campbellville scored two runs in the first to take the lead on a walk to Roberts, Baynton's single and a double by Currie. By the third inning Oakville had pulled ahead with a run in the second and two more in their third. However, Campbellville regained the lead with a single run in their third on singles by Currie and Gadd and Early; and a walk to Roberts followed by singles by Currie and Gadd plated the go ahead run in the fourth. This made the score 4-3.

Oakville went ahead with a run in the fifth and two in the sixth. Campbellville scored twice in the sixth.

Charles Currie led the 10-hit Campbellville attack with a double and three singles, Scott Gadd doubled and singled twice, Scott Early had two singles and Dan Thomson singled once. Thomson improved his personal season's record to four wins, two losses, and a tie for nine of Campbellville's 13 games.

Nursing a 3-1 lead into the sixth inning the Villagers finally put the game away with three runs on a walk to Robinson, Bertasson's double and a towering triple off the left field fence by Tim Roberts. Roberts scored the sixth run on an infield grounder.
