Explanatory Note to By-Law No. 6-70

TOWN OF MILTON

By-law No. 6-70 of the Corporation of the Town of Milton is a By-law designating certain areas in the Town of Milton as Flood Zones and amends the original Zoning and By-law No. 31-69 in this respect.

It was intended that By-law No. 6-70 would be a temporary By-law until certain remedial works on 16 Mile Creek and the West Branch of the Creek were carried out and it was, therefore, approved by the Ontario Municipal Board to expire on the 1st day of February, 1971.

Further Orders of the Ontario Municipal Board extended the period of the By-law to the 30th day of June, 1971 and further to the 30th day of June, 1972, and further to September 22, 1972.

Since the remedial works have not been undertaken, the Corporation of the Town of Milton are making application for a further extension to By-law No. 6-70.

THENCE continuing Northwestly along the Southwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being the Northerly limit of Lot 7, Concession 5, a distance of 1,980 feet, or less to the Northerly angle of the said Lot 7;

THENCE continuing Northwestly along the Southwesterly limit of the road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being the Northerly limit of Lot 8 in Concession 5, a distance of 1,980 feet more or less, to the Northerly angle of the said Lot 8;

THENCE continuing Northwestly along the Southwesterly limit of the said road allowance between Concessions 5 and 6, and being the Northerly limit of Lot 9 in Concession 5, a distance of 1,430.63 feet to a Standard Iron Bar planted at a point therein;

SECONDLY, a 66 foot road established by By-law number 7 in 1881, for the Township of Nassagaweya, through Lots 6, 7 and 8, Concession 5, Township of Nassagaweya, more particularly described as follows: ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in the Township of Nassagaweya, County of Halton, Province of Ontario, and being composed of Part of Lots 6, 7 and 8 in the 5th Concession of the said Township, and which said parcel is a strip of land having a perpendicular width of 66 feet and lying 33 feet on either side of the herein described centre line.
