Stainless steel milk tanks produced by new Milton firm

Krohnert Manufacturing, one of the most recent industries to set up shop in Milton, started production recently. The firm which employs 15 to 20 and manufactures stainless steel tanks, semi-trailers and tanks to be mounted on trucks is situated on Steele's Ave. near the Third Line.

Chief production at this time was in milk tankers. Ontario and Quebec are the main markets for the product although the firm sells coast to coast. The market in Quebec and Ontario is determined by the locations of dairy farms.

Paul Krohnert, president of the firm and father of Dave, started the operation in West Hill in 1944 and operated there until recently

when the moved to the Milton plant.

The plant in Milton is considerably larger than the West Hill plant and the site appealed to the firm because of access to Highway 401, Dave noted.

Hire locally
When the firm moved many of the men moved with it but

several fitters and welders have been hired locally and Krohnert expects to hire more in the near future.

It takes four to five weeks to build a tanker. While the huge milk tankers are still the firm's greatest market, company executives are eyeing the chemical carriers as a market they would eventually move into.

While the 15,000 square foot building isn't completed yet, production is carrying on. An office is not yet completed but work is continuing and company executives hope the building will be completed within the next few months.

Christmas lighting is Chamber topic

Tight knit group

Main St. lighting the Chamber was chastized by Andy Falk. Falk suggested the group was a tight knit group and more should be done for members on streets other than Main St. and those members not in the downtown core.

President Harris agreed more should be done for those members and said directors had discussed means to overcome the problem and welcomed suggestions.

A complaint about poor garbage pickup from Mrs. H. Servos of the Milton Department Store received support from a number of people who are having or have had the same problem.

Mrs. Servos explained garbage was picked up twice a week and it

didn't seem to matter what time it was put out, kids and animals had the refuse strewn about the yard and street before it was picked up.

Nick Chuchmach of the Charles Hotel sympathized with Mrs. Servos and noted the hotel had a truck to take their refuse to the dump, rather than pay more money for better town pickup. 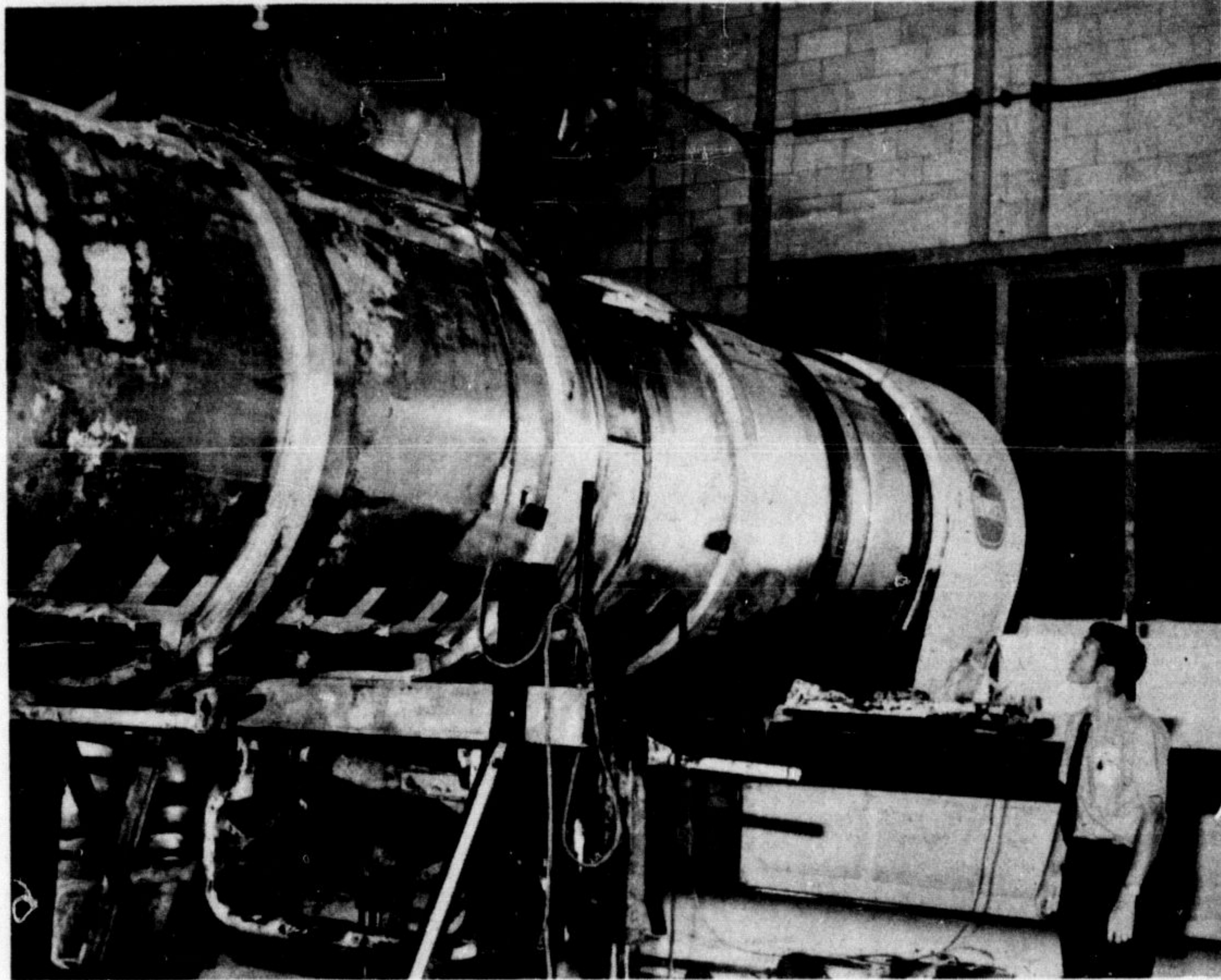

Campbellville couple adopt Viet Nam child

Mr. and Mrs. E. C. Pease of Campbellville have "adopted" seven-year-old Nguyen Thinh of Viet Nam. By contributing \$17 a month through Foster Parents Plan of Canada, Mr. and Mrs. Pease give the child and the family material and financial aid aimed at strengthening the family unit by helping each member. The child is symbolic of aid given to the entire family.

Before Mr. and Mrs. Pease became Thinh's Foster Parents, the family struggled to survive on an income of approximately \$40 per month. This income is earned by Thinh's mother working as a day laborer. His father is unable to work because he suffers from mental illness. The family income is not sufficient to support her mother and her husband and their six children. Home for the family is a very small house made of corrugated iron roof, earth flooring and cardboard walls.

Cash plus goods
Mr. and Mrs. Pease's contribution of \$17 a month brings the family a monthly cash grant, distribution of goods such as vitamins, blankets, towels, soap and other useful items, medical and dental care, the sustained guidance and counselling of social workers and the benefit of special programs. A strong emphasis is placed on education. All Foster Children (and their brothers and sisters if possible) must attend school. Vocational training courses given or supported by PLAN in some countries are available to Foster Children, their brothers and sisters and in some cases, their parents. The aim is to give each member of the family the tools to help themselves become independent and self-supporting. Special programs adapted to the

needs of each country also meet these aims.

In Viet Nam, for example, PLAN makes use of available medical facilities in Saigon to arrange for medical and dental care for Foster Children and their families. Foster Parents and Foster Children correspond monthly (letters are translated by PLAN) and often develop warm and affectionate relationships which mean as much to the child as the material and financial aid.

Foster Parents Plan is currently working in ten countries in South America and Asia. Over 53,000 children are currently being aided by individuals, groups and families in the U.S., Canada and Australia. 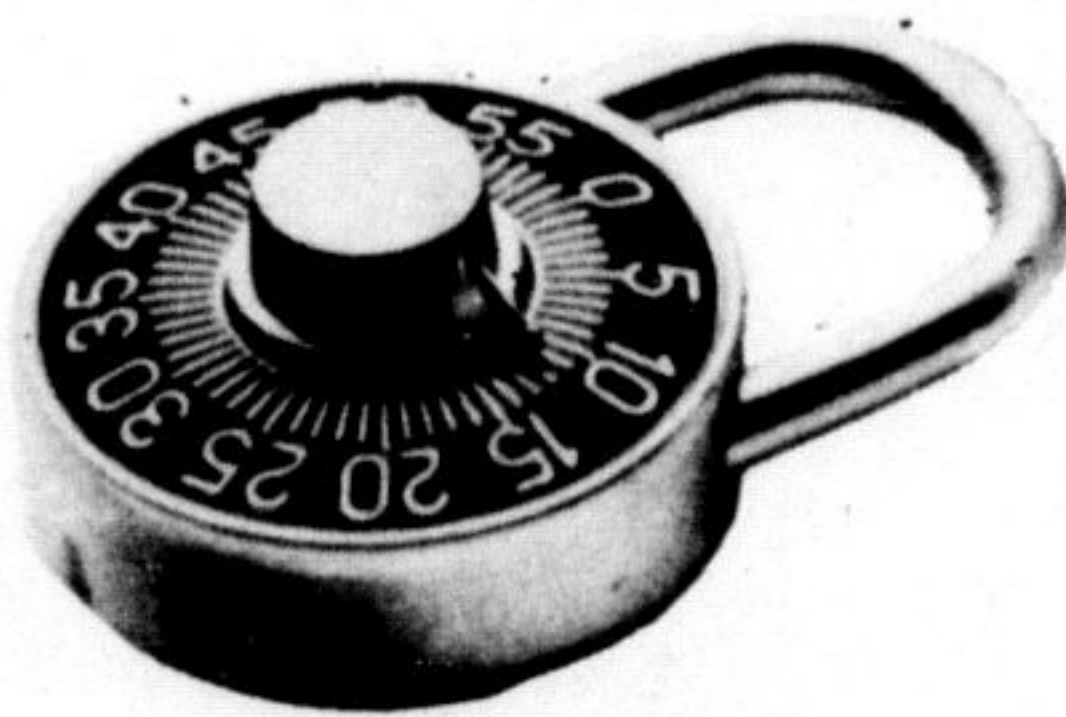
