

Grant water service at owner's expense

A water service will be granted Mr. and Mrs. N. McPhail for their north Burlington home, provided they are willing to undertake the cost of extending the line, Milton Council agreed Monday.

The water service subject has been under discussion since the town decided to abandon an old five inch line which went from the wells to the reservoir. Installation of a new line made the old one uneconomical and impractical and residents taking water from it were advised of plans to discontinue use of the line.

Council declined to alter its latest Nov. 1 date for cutting off the old line, despite suggestions from Mr. and Mrs. McPhail that there was not sufficient time to locate a new source.

Mayor B. Best reviewed the town installed a new 20 inch main to the reservoir at a cost of \$175,000 and until the use of the five inch line was discontinued, it was not possible to take full use of the new line and the automatic controls on the system. He estimated hydro for pumping in the five inch line was about \$90 monthly and if the pumping was discontinued the line would freeze.

Discussion as to whether the town had some moral obligation to continue a water supply which had been provided for eight years, indicated the municipality didn't feel it should share in the cost of the solution.

Council agreed to grant a one inch service on the understanding the applicant would bear the costs of connection and installation.

Kerr "super minister" secretary of justice

George Kerr, MPP for Halton West, has moved into his third portfolio since joining the cabinet of the Ontario Government. Kerr has been named secretary of justice to fill the super ministry vacated by Allan Lawrence who chose to run for federal politics. Kerr was first appointed to

head Energy and Natural Resources. When he was shifted from that controversial post to the Ministry of Colleges and Universities, it was commonly thought he had been demoted.

Other cabinet changes in the last shuffle saw Eric Winkler mover from consumer and commercial relations to the super ministry where he'll act as chairman of the management board of cabinet.

John Twining Clement moved into consumer and commercial relation; Jack McNie to colleges and universities; Claude Bennett and Margaret Birch are ministers without portfolios.

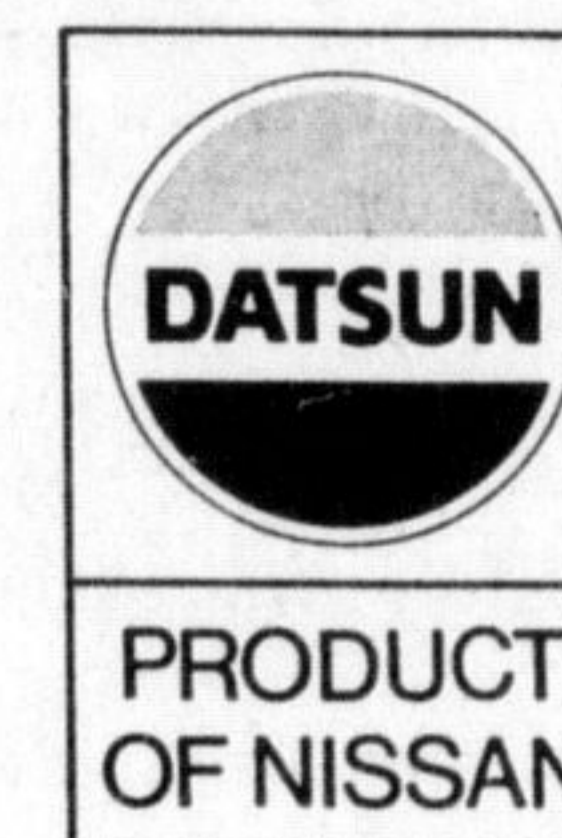

ESQUESING Township Council BRIEFS

At their regular meeting Monday night, Esquesing Council:

—Endorsed a resolution passed by the University Women's Club of Milton and district dealing with the problem of domestic solid waste disposal.

—Passed a by-law authorizing the use of the new composite ballot at this year's municipal election.

—Clerk-treasurer Delmar French reported council has been granted extended approval of its agricultural holding by-law until April 1, 1973.

—Mr. French also reported that Springbank Sand and Gravel had withdrawn their application to the OMB for approval of a quarry site in Esquesing one day before last Thursday's scheduled hearing. He said the same company's application for a site in Nassagaweya township will be heard by the OMB at a later date.

—Deputy-reeve Russell Miller referred a complaint from Casey Bos, a resident of the Fourth Line near Acton concerning the amount of dust on the road recently. Roads superintendent C. E. "Bud" Snow said the road was in such bad shape it had to be graded which unfortunately resulted in temporary excess dust.

Reeve Tom Hill presided for the three hour meeting with all councillors present.

Ask subsidy on bus line

A subsidy to continue the operation of Milton Bus Lines was asked from Milton Council Monday, with a request ratepayers be allowed to vote on it in December.

The need for more information on operating costs and complete detail required to prepare an agreement was stressed before a question could be formulated to place before electors. The by-law for such a referendum would have to be approved before Nov. 1.

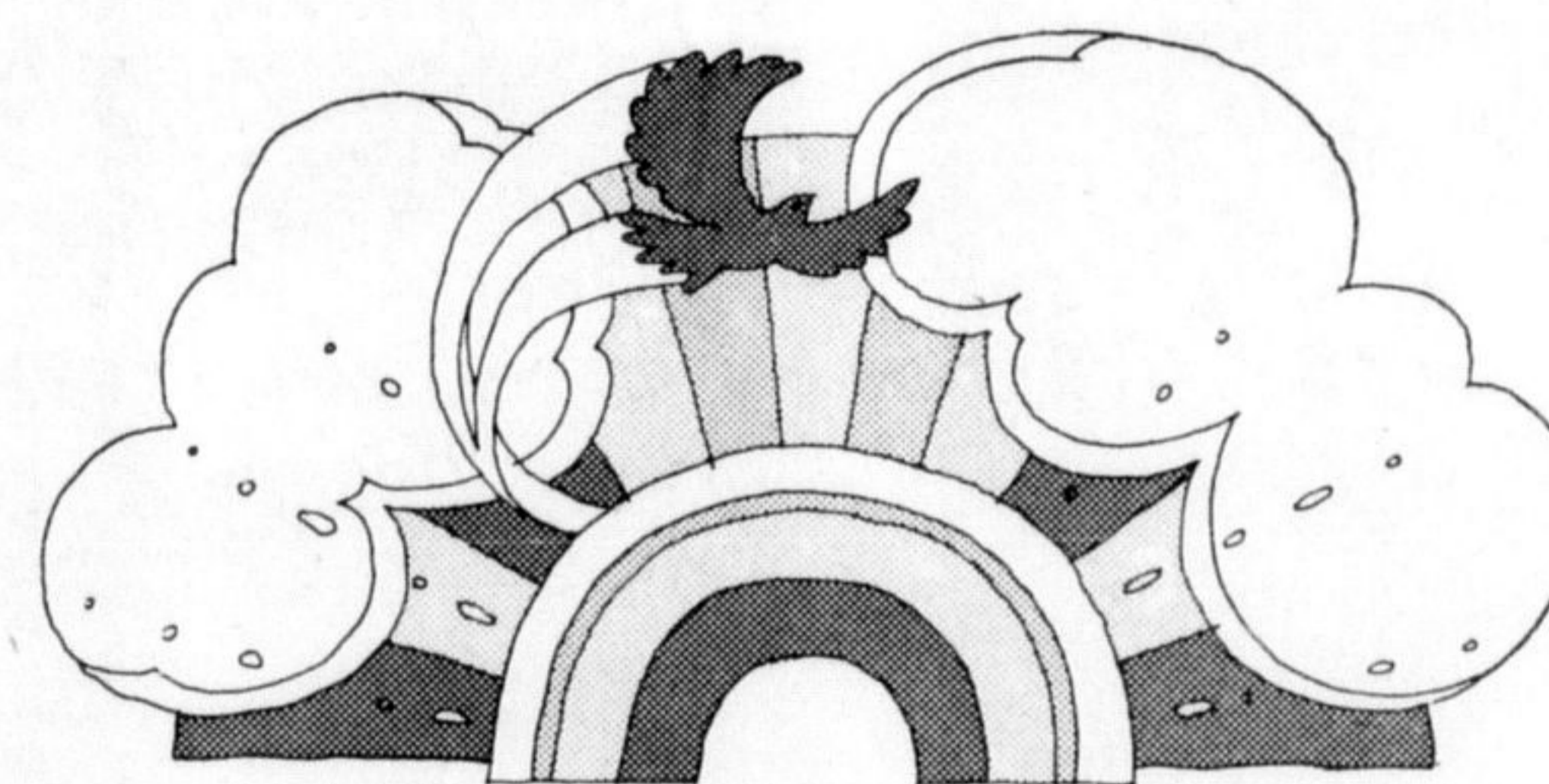
