



The Municipal Elections Act, by which the Mayor, Members of Council, the Hydro Commission and the Public and Separate School Boards are Elected, has been drastically changed for this year and subsequent Elections.

The main change is that there will be No Nomination night

Any person interested in being a Candidate for the above Offices must pick up a Nomination paper at the Clerk's Office, have it signed by Ten (10) persons who are on the Voters List and file with the Clerk.

The responsibility for filing a Nomination paper rests with the person who wishes to be nominated.

THE FIRST DAY FOR FILING NOMINATIONS IS THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 9th, 1972 AND THE LAST DAY IS 5:00 P.M. ON MONDAY, NOVEMBER 13th, 1972

> Booklets describing pertinent points are available at the Library or can be purchased at the Town Hall for \$1.25

There are no Assessment requirements in order to be a Candidate for any of the Offices.

Any person 18 years of age or over on or before December 4th, 1972 is eligible to be on the list of Electors and is, therefore, qualified to run for office.

There is provision for PROXY VOTING and the required forms are available at the Clerk's Office and must be filed by 5:00 p.m. November 28th, 1972.

Two ADVANCE POLLS will be held for anyone who will not be in Town on Election Day. The First Advance Poll will be open on Monday, November 27th, 1972 and the Second on Saturday, December 2nd, 1972, between the hours of 11a.m. and 8 p.m..

VOTERS LISTS will be posted in each Polling Subdivision for that particular subdivision and a complete list at the Clerk's Office. It is your responsibility to see that your name is on the list. If not on the list then apply at the Clerk's Office to have it put on.
