## MacArthur fights HRCA land trade

Nassagaweya Reeve Mrs. A. MacArthur took an adamant stand against a Halton Region Conservation Authority proposal to trade off over 36 acres for a nine acre parcel near Crawford Lake. She argued her point at the HRCA meeting Wednesday.

The 40 acres the Authority is considering trading off is on the north side of the Crawford Lake property and the nine acre parcel belonging to Cliff Hurren fronts on Base Line Road.

Ask deferral  
The Authority saw the nine

acre parcel as possible parking lot for the Crawford Lake area. The proposal came as a recommendation from the Land Advisory Committee. Mr. Hurren had asked the matter be deferred.

Mrs. MacArthur urged the authority drop the idea rather than deferring or considering it any longer. She suggested it was poor business to deal off 36 acres for nine. She suggested the authority had insisted they needed the Howard property and now were willing to trade almost 40 acres of it off.

## Clamp down on weeds

There won't be any mercy for speculators or landowners who allow weeds to grow on their holdings in Halton, according to Halton County Council.

At a regular meeting Wednesday Council members passed a resolution instructing weed inspector Doug Currie to crack down on uncontrolled weeds in the county.

The matter first came to light when Currie reported to the administration committee and indicated on large fields his cutters cut back 150 feet from the road. He said the weeds would not be of danger if they are isolated and it wouldn't be fair to the landowner to be put to extra expense if no harm was being done.

Oakville Deputy Reeve Harry Barrett and Nassagaweya Reeve Mrs. A. MacArthur argued no sympathy should be given to land speculators and the weed inspector should follow the act governing weed control to the letter of the law. Both urged a clamp-down.

## Safety, drug talks given

Talks on safety and drugs have been given to north Halton residents in recent weeks by Const. Jim Redpath, accident prevention officer of Milton OPP.

He spoke to 326 students of Sunshine School, Limehouse and Norval Public Schools about safety. Const. Redpath also lectured on drugs to 75 Glen Williams area residents.
