

MDHS honors top students at Friday commencement

A long and impressive list of awards, certificates, and bursaries were presented to students and recent graduates of Milton District High School during the school's commencement exercises Friday night.

Highest standing in grade nine was achieved by Janet Schreiber who won a \$20 proficiency prize from the Halton County Board of Education and the Inglis-Poole trophy. Her per cent was 86.

The Campbellville Women's Institute prize of a book was awarded to Steven Wollaston for the high standing in grade nine English, with an average of 87 per cent.

Five awards were presented to Gordon Agnew for the highest standing in grade 12. He had 88.2 per cent. Gordon was presented with a Halton County Board of Education proficiency prize of \$40; the George Dawson Shield; the North American Rockwell of Canada Ltd.
