Having taken these precautions, you can find your way back to where you came from with comparative ease during

daylight hours. Can be hazardous

The League states that travel after dark in an unfamiliar bush can be extremely hazardous. The traveller is well advised to make an emergency camp overnight under such conditions. For this purpose, it is well to carry along some emergency food, matches in a waterproof container, a hunting knife and some utensils for preparing food.

If you should become uncertain of your directions in the bush, above all, do not panic. Take stock of the situation, make yourself comfortable for the night with a fire and an improvised lean-to out of evergreen branches using natural protection such as a clump of trees or a rock to shield you from the wind and reflect heat from your fire. The morning will bring light and a new day when, in all probability, you will find the right course to follow.
