Jim's Billiards remained

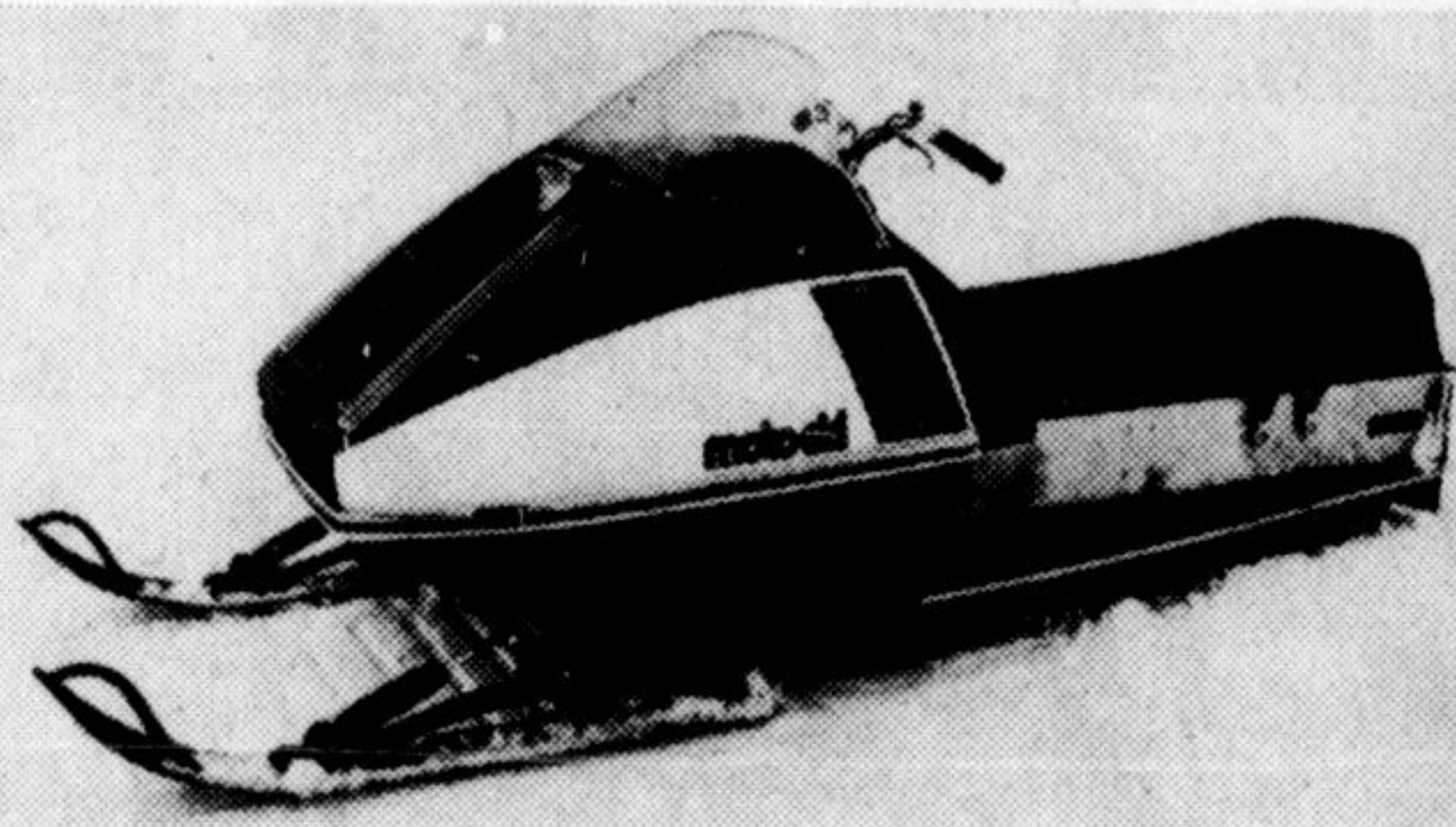
