Board approves agreement

Halton County Board of Education formally approved a joint use of recreation facilities agreement with the town of Milton Thursday at their meeting.

The agreement provides for the free use of the area and other town recreation facilities by the schools and free community use of the schools by the community. In both instances only those activities that don't conflict with current programming will be implemented.

Groups wishing to use school facilities can make arrangements through the town's recreation committee. The agreement is considered to be a significant one because it opens the door for future co-operative agreements such as those in Burlington and Oakville. In those two towns arrangements have been made whereby swimming pools are built on school property by the town and maintained by the Board of Education. That sort of agreement provides the schools with a pool during school hours and the community with a pool in other than school hours.

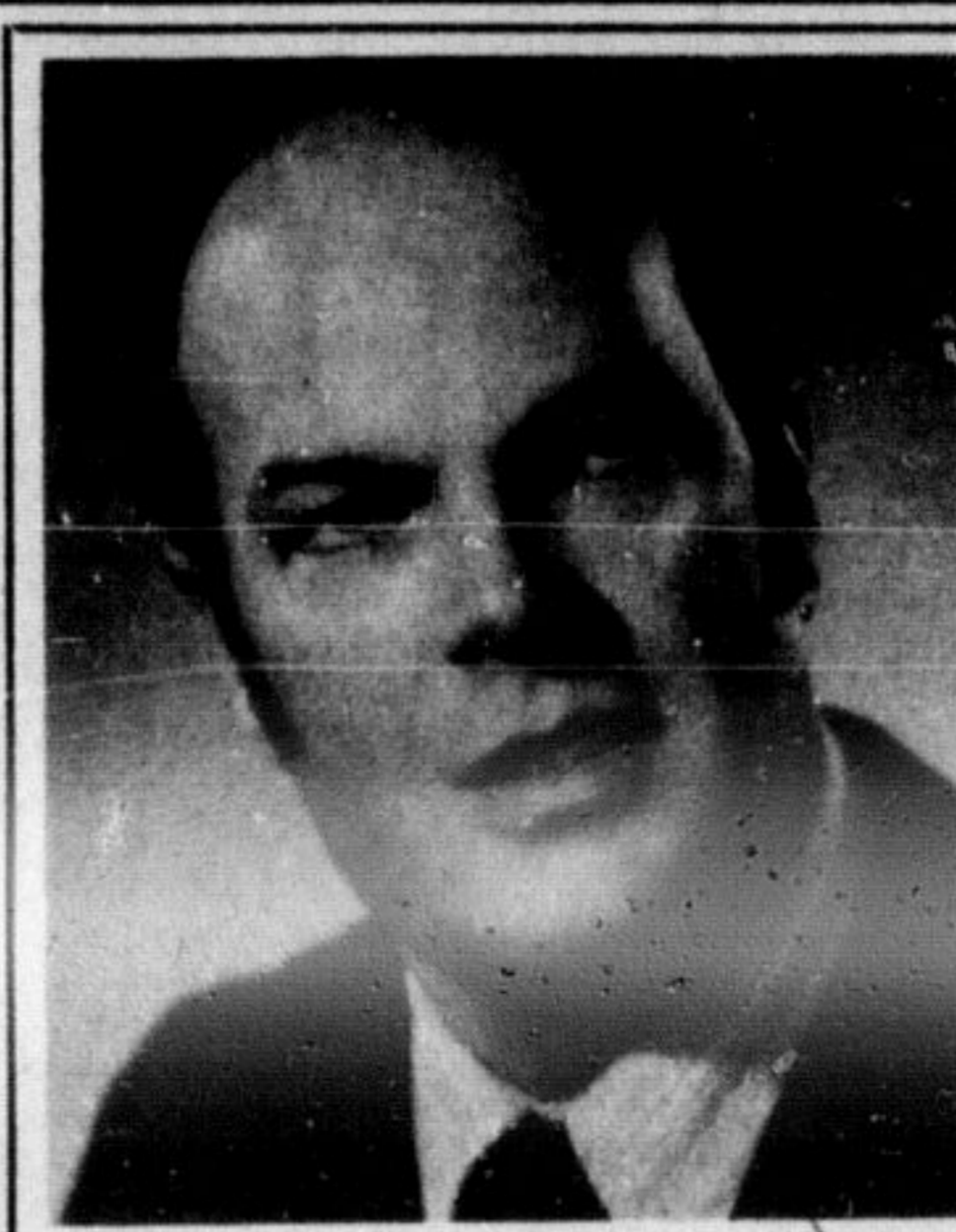
