### Draft plan approval on two subdivisions

Conditional draft plan approval was granted by the Department of Municipal Affairs on Victoria Wood and Wimpey Homes Ltd. second phases, Milton Council was advised last week.

Mayor Brian Best pointed out the conditional approvals require assurances to the Department that "sufficient storm drainage facilities will exist to accommodate development of the plan". He also noted another condition under which the developers or owners were required to "satisfy all the requirements, financial or otherwise, of the municipality re-surfacing of roads, installation of services and drainage".

Councillor G. Krantz suggested since council agreed to keep Mrs. V. Russell, president of the WD Ratepayers Association informed, copies of the

conditional draft plan approvals should be forwarded to her. Members agreed to this.
