



Four proposed federal ridings Firefighters raise \$1,062 for Muscular Dystrophy

Thanks to their "toll gate" promotion at Milton Plaza back in October, Milton Fire Department set a local record in their 1972 fund-raising drive for the Muscular Dystrophy Association of Canada.

The brigade has collected \$1,062.05 for the MD fund, firefighters reported. Their usual collections are in the \$150 to \$220 range but this year besides the canisters which they placed in stores around town, the brigade set up a toll booth on two weekends at Milton Plaza. The voluntary toll booth collected \$801 for the MD fund, as generous motorists "paid a toll" when they drove into the Plaza parking lot.

Fire prevention too
Chief A. E. Clement said the "toll booth" had a double duty for the fire brigade. It was held near Fire Prevention Week and those who gave a donation received some fire prevention literature, pencils and balloons in return for the donation. "We not only swelled the Muscular Dystrophy fund, we distributed quite a bit of fire prevention literature," the chief said. "All the adults received a pencil with a fire prevention message printed on it, and if there were any children in the car they received a free balloon—also gearing a message about fire prevention."

Last week Chief Clement collected the canisters which had been in local stores for a couple of months. The coins were counted and yielded \$261.05, and even the canister collection was higher than in any previous year.

Last year the brigade's best year to date, MD collection-wise. The canisters in 1971 yielded \$220.
