NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO The Ontario Municipal Board by the Corporation of the Town of Milton for approval of a By-law to regulate land use passed pursuant to Section 35 of The Planning Act.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton intends to apply to The Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 of The Planning Act for approval of By-law No. 58-72 passed on the 16th day of October, 1972.

A note giving an explanation of the purpose and effect of the By-law and stating the lands affected thereby is also furnished herewith.

ANY PERSON INTERESTED MAY, within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Milton notice of his objection to approval of the said By-law, together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the By-law may within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Milton notice of his support of approval of the said By-law together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said By-law but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the By-law will be considered.

THE LAST DATE FOR FILING OBJECTIONS will be the 17th day of January, 1973.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MILTON BY-LAW NO. 58-72 A By-law to amend By-law No. 31-69.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton deems it advisable to amend By-law Number 31-69, as amended;

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton ENACTS as follows:

1. That Section 2 of By-law Number 31-69 is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (96) thereof the following subsection (96a):

"(96a) 'SWIMMING POOL, PRIVATE' means any body of water, permanently located outdoors on privately owned property, contained by artificial means, and used and maintained for the purpose of swimming, wading, diving or bathing."

2. That Section 6 (2) of By-law Number 31-69 is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (f) thereof the following subsection (g):

"(g) PRIVATE SWIMMING POOLS (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this By-law to the contrary, in a Residential Zone a private swimming pool and structures in conjunction with such a swimming pool may be erected and used in the interior side or rear yard provided that:

(1) no part of such swimming pool shall be located closer than 25 feet to any street line or closer than 4 feet to any rear or side lot line, or closer than 10 feet to that portion of the rear lot line which adjoins the interior side yard of the adjoining lot if such lot is built upon, or which adjoins the required interior side yard of the adjoining lot if such lot is vacant, and (2) No water circulating or treatment equipment such as pumps or filters shall be located closer than 10 feet to any rear or side lot line.

(11) A private swimming pool shall not be considered part of the lot coverage provided that no part of such swimming pool or its railing protrudes more than 4 1/2 feet above the finished grade."

3. This By-law shall become effective on the date hereof subject to receiving the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.

READ A FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME and FINALLY PASSED THIS 16th DAY OF OCTOBER, 1972.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MILTON BY-LAW NO. 58-72

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This By-law will amend the existing Restricted Area By-law of the Milton Planning Area, being the Zoning By-law of the Town of Milton.

By-law No. 58-72 is intended to define "Private Swimming Pools" and also eliminate confusion that has arisen due to the fact that the Restricted Area By-law for the Milton Planning Area as amended, does not presently mention or provide for "Private Swimming Pools".

The By-law also regulates the location of Private Swimming Pools and accessory equipment on lots.

Any further information that may be required in connection with this By-law can be obtained by calling the Clerk's Office, Town of Milton.

By-law No. 31-69, as amended, being the Zoning By-law of the Town of Milton, is also available for inspection at the Clerk's Office.

Offer 12 classes at night school

Halton County Board of Education will register some 12 night school classes at Milton High School on Wednesday, Jan. 10.

Several of the classes currently operating at the school will be re-registered, such as bridge, keep fit and recreation, yoga, and

automobile maintenance for men and women. It is hoped some of the students currently in class will wish to continue for another 10 weeks.

The furniture re-finishing course will be expanded next term to offer some minor upholstery. Students will be able to strip and re-finish furniture and in addition, basic techniques of upholstery will be taught. Small items of furniture may be brought to the school for upholstery. The lack of storage facilities dictates that the furniture must be taken home after each class.

Persons handy with metals may wish to enrol in the welding and metalwork class.

Two new business courses are available, bookkeeping for a small business and brush up your typing. The bookkeeping course will be of interest to those people engaged in a small business, or for those who wish to learn basic bookkeeping and accounting skills. If you have not typed for some time, and wish to review past skills, you may be interested in the course entitled "brush up your typing". This course is not for the beginner.

Night school offers two courses for the electrically minded - practical electronics and electricity for the homeowner. Here is the opportunity to repair your radio and do minor television repairs. The homeowner may learn the theory and practice of installing circuits, lights, etc.

An attempt will be made to form a crocheting class, as there has been a large increase in crocheting classes across the county, especially among the younger housewives and mothers.

Classes will begin the week of Jan. 15. In addition to the above general interest classes, a Grade 13 sociology credit course will also be registered on Jan. 10, and will begin Feb. 13. This class will be conducted on Tuesday and Thursday evenings for 15 weeks.
